Άρθρο 1 Σκοπός

Το παρόν επιτυγχάνει την οριστική επιστροφή στην Ελλάδα ιδιωτικής συλλογής σημαντικών αρχαιοτήτων του κυκλαδικού πολιτισμού, η οποία βρίσκεται στη Νέα Υόρκη, την πολυετή και διαρκή προβολή του κυκλαδικού πολιτισμού στο Μητροπολιτικό Μουσείο Τέχνης της Νέας Υόρκης και τη μακρόχρονη και δυναμική συνεργασία μεταξύ του Υπουργείου Πολιτισμού και Αθλητισμού και του Μητροπολιτικού Μουσείου Τέχνης της Νέας Υόρκης στον τομέα των αρχαιολογικών ερευνών.

Άρθρο 2 Αντικείμενο

Αντικείμενο του παρόντος είναι η κύρωση της Συμφωνίας, που υπέγραψε την 21η Ιουλίου 2022, το Υπουργείο Πολιτισμού και Αθλητισμού της Ελληνικής Δημοκρατίας με το Μουσείο Κυκλαδικής Τέχνης, το Metropolitan Museum of Art (Μητροπολιτικό Μουσείο Τέχνης) της Νέας Υόρκης και το Hellenic Ancient Culture Institute Inc. (Ινστιτούτο Αρχαίου Ελληνικού Πολιτισμού) του Ντελαγουέρ, σχετικά με την επιστροφή στην Ελλάδα, ιδιωτικής συλλογής εκατόν εξήντα μίας (161) αρχαιοτήτων του κυκλαδικού πολιτισμού, ευρισκόμενης στη Νέα Υόρκη και την έκθεση αυτής και άλλων τέχνεργων του κυκλαδικού πολιτισμού στο Μητροπολιτικό Μουσείο Τέχνης της Νέας Υόρκης.

Άρθρο 3 Κύρωση της Συμφωνίας

Κυρώνεται και έχει ισχύ νόμου η Συμφωνία με τα συνημμένα σε αυτήν Παραρτήματα, η οποία υπογράφηκε μεταξύ του Υπουργείου Πολιτισμού και Αθλητισμού της Ελληνικής Δημοκρατίας, του νομικού προσώπου με την επωνυμία «Hellenic Ancient Culture Institute Inc.» (Ινστιτούτο Αρχαίου Ελληνικού Πολιτισμού) της Πολιτείας Ντελαγουέρ των Η.Π.Α., του Νομικού Προσώπου Ιδιωτικού Δικαίου με την επωνυμία «Μουσείο Κυκλαδικής Τέχνης» και του νομικού προσώπου με την επωνυμία «Metropolitan Museum of Art» (Μητροπολιτικό Μουσείο Τέχνης) της Πολιτείας της Νέας Υόρκης των Η.Π.Α., το πρωτότυπο κείμενο της οποίας, στην ελληνική και αγγλική γλώσσα, καθώς και τα Παραρτήματα αυτής έχουν ως εξής:

Στην Αθήνα, σήμερα 21 Ιουλίου του έτους 2022, στο κτίριο επί της οδού Μπουμπουλίνας αρ. 20, όπου στεγάζεται το Υπουργείο Πολιτισμού και Αθλητισμού

Νεοφύτου Δούκα αρ. 4), νόμιμα εκπροσωπούμενου για την υπογραφή της παρούσας συμφωνίας, από την Πρόεδρο του Διοικητικού Συμβουλίου αυτού, κ. Κασσάνδρα Μαρινοπούλου, δυνάμει απόφασης του Διοικητικού Συμβουλίου αυτού (το «Κυκλαδικό Μουσείο») και
- (Δ) Του νομικού προσώπου με την επωνυμία «METROPOLITAN MUSEUM OF ART" (Μητροπολιτικό Μουσείο Τέχνης) με έδρα την Πολιτεία της Νέας Υόρκης των Ηνωμένων Πολιτειών Αμερικής (1000 Fifth Avenue, New York, New York, 10028, United States), νόμιμα εκπροσωπούμενου για την υπογραφή της παρούσας συμφωνίας, από τον Διευθυντή του, κ. Max Hollein (Μαξ Χόλλαϊν), δυνάμει απόφασης του Διοικητικού Συμβουλίου αυτού (το «ΜΕΤ»).

ΑΦΟΥ ΕΛΑΒΑΝ ΥΠΟΨΗ ΚΑΙ ΕΚΑΝΑΝ ΑΜΟΙΒΑΙΑ ΑΠΟΔΕΚΤΑ ΤΑ ΕΞΗΣ:

1. Ο ΗΑCΙ αποτελεί μη κερδοσκοπικό νομικό πρόσωπο που έχει συσταθεί σύμφωνα με το δίκαιο της έδρας του και διοικείται από Διοικητικό Συμβούλιο, του οποίου ο Πρόεδρος και η πλειοψηφία των μελών διορίζεται από το Κυκλαδικό Μουσείο. Στους σκοπούς του ΗΑCΙ ανήκει, μεταξύ άλλων (i) η προβολή της πολιτιστικής κληρονομιάς της Ελλάδας και η τόνωση του παγκόσμιου ενδιαφέροντος και της γνώσης σχετικά με τις Ελληνικές αρχαιότητες, (ii) η απόκτηση, μέσω δωρεών, δανείων ή κληροδοτημάτων, της κυριότητας και/ή κατοχής έργων τέχνης, αντικειμένων και μνημείων της Ελλάδας που χρονολογούνται από τους προϊστορικούς χρόνους έως και τον Μεσαίωνα και η μέριμνα για τη φύλαξη, μελέτη και συντήρησή τους, με το δικαίωμα της τελικής μεταβίβασης στο Κυκλαδικό Μουσείο ή σε άλλα μουσεία της Ελλάδας, σύμφωνα με τις αποφάσεις του Διοικητικού Συμβουλίου αυτού και τους νόμους περί πολιτιστικής κληρονομιάς της Ελληνικής Δημοκρατίας και (iii) η έκθεση και η μέριμνα για την έκθεση έργων τέχνης, αντικειμένων και μνημείων της Ελλάδας που χρονολογούνται από τους προϊστορικούς χρόνους έως και τον Μεσαίωνά σε μουσεία ή

άλλους κατάλληλους χώρους που εκθέτουν ή μελετούν αντικείμενα του ελληνικού ή άλλων πολιτισμών ή χωρών, σύμφωνα με τις αποφάσεις του Διοικητικού Συμβουλίου αυτού, υπό την προϋπόθεση ότι ακολουθείται η νομοθεσία περί πολιτιστικής κληρονομιάς της Ελληνικής Δημοκρατίας.

- 2. Την 21η Ιουλίου 2022 καταρτίστηκε στη Νέα Υόρκη, ενώπιον Συμβολαιογράφου, σύμβαση εισφοράς («Contribution Agreement») μεταξύ του Leonard Stern (Λέοναρντ Στερν), μόνιμου κατοίκου Ηνωμένων Πολιτειών Αμερικής (ο «L.S.») και του HACI, η οποία προσαρτάται στη παρούσα ως Παράρτημα Α΄ (η «Σύμβαση Εισφοράς»), δυνάμει της οποίας ο L.S. παρέδωσε προς τον HACI, λόγω δωρεάς, όλα τα δικαιώματά του, συμπεριλαμβανόμενης της κατοχής μιας συλλογής 161 Κυκλαδικών αρχαιοτήτων, την οποία έως τότε κατείχε, ο ίδιος και η οποία απεικονίζεται στο Παράρτημα Β΄ που επισυνάπτεται στην παρούσα συμφωνία (η «Συλλογή»).
- 3. Ο L.S. παρεχώρησε τη συλλογή στον ΗΑCI, σύμφωνα με τους κατωτέρω όρους και πλαίσω:
- (α) ο HACI έχει ήδη λάβει από την αρμόδια φορολογική αρχή [the United States Internal Revenue Service (IRS)] βεβαιωτική επιστολή με ημερομηνία 6 Ιουλίου 2022, σύμφωνα με την οποία ο HACI υπόκειται στο αφορολόγητο καθεστώς του άρθρου 501(α), ως οργανισμός περιλαμβανόμενος στα άρθρα 501(γ)(3) και 509(α)(3) του Κώδικα Εσωτερικών Εσόδων του 1986.
- (β) Το αργότερο μέχρι και την 21ⁿ Ιουλίου 2022 θα έχει υπογραφεί μεταξύ των HACI και MET, σύμβαση σχετικά με την έκθεση της Συλλογής στο MET, σύμφωνα με τη σύμβαση έκθεσης που επισυνάφθηκε στη Σύμβαση Εισφοράς και επισυνάπτεται και στην παρούσα ως Παράρτημα Γ' (η «Σύμβαση Έκθεσης»),
- (γ) αμέσως μετά την πλήρωση του ανωτέρω όρου (β) και πάντως όχι αργότερα από την 10ⁿ Σεπτεμβρίου 2022, το Ελληνικό Κράτος θα έχει εγκρίνει επίσημα, σύμφωνα με την ελληνική νομοθεσία (συμπεριλαμβανόμενης της δημοσίευσης στην Εφημερίδα της Κυβέρνησης), την κατοχή της Συλλογής από τον ΗΑΟΙ καθώς και την έκθεση της στο ΜΕΤ, σύμφωνα με τη Σύμβαση Έκθεσης,
- (δ) Με την πλήρωση των όρων (β) και (γ), η Σύμβαση Εισφοράς καθίσταται οριστικά ισχυρή και αμετάκλητη και δεσμεύει τους Ł.S. και HACI, χωρίς να απαιτείται άλλο ξεχωριστό έγγραφο προς τούτο. Σε περίπτωση που δεν εκπληρωθεί οποιοσδήποτε από τους όρους (β) και (γ), η Σύμβαση Εισφοράς και η Σύμβαση Έκθεσης ανατρέπονται, οι L.S. και HACI και το ΜΕΤ αποδεσμεύονται από κάθε υποχρέωση σχετική με αυτές και η Συλλογή αποδίδεται στον L.S. με δαπάνη του ίδιου.
- 4. Την 21 Ιουλίου 2022 καταρτίστηκε στην Νέα Υόρκη μεταξύ των HACI και ΜΕΤ η Σύμβαση Έκθεσης και, συνεπώς, πληρώθηκε ο όρος (β) της παραγράφου 3.

Β. ΣΥΜΦΩΝΗΣΑΝ ΚΑΙ ΕΚΑΝΑΝ ΑΜΟΙΒΑΙΑ ΑΠΟΔΕΚΤΑ ΤΑ ΑΚΟΛΟΥΘΑ:

- **5.** Το Υπουργείο συμβάλλεται στην παρούσα συμφωνία ως εκπρόσωπος του Ελληνικού Δημοσίου. Σύμφωνα με τον Ελληνικό Αρχαιολογικό Νόμο, το Ελληνικό Δημόσιο είναι ο αποκλειστικός ιδιοκτήτης και νομέας της Συλλογής.
- 6. Το Υπουργείο, ως εκπρόσωπος του Ελληνικού Δημοσίου και αρμόδιος φορέας για την προστασία της πολιτιστικής κληρονομιάς της Ελλάδας με την παρούσα συμφωνία (i)

αναγνωρίζει, αποκλειστικά για τους σκοπούς των επόμενων παραγράφων, ότι ο HACI κατέστη κάτοχος της Συλλογής δυνάμει της Σύμβασης Εισφοράς, η οποία είναι ισχυρή σύμφωνα με τη νομοθεσία της πολιτείας της Νέας Υόρκης και (ii) εγκρίνει την έκθεση της Συλλογής στο MET, σύμφωνα με τους εξής όρους:

α. Το αργότερο έως την 30η Σεπτεμβρίου έτους 2022, ο HACI θα φυλάσσει και θα διατηρεί τη Συλλογή στην σημερινή κατοικία του L.S. και ο L.S. θα είναι υπεύθυνος για την ασφάλειά και ασφάλιση αυτής. Ακολούθως, η Συλλογή θα παραδοθεί στο ΜΕΤ με την καθοδήγηση του HACI και τη μέριμνα, ευθύνη και δαπάνη του ΜΕΤ, με εξαίρεση το μεγάλο ειδώλω (αρ. τεμαχίου 105), το οποίο ο HACI θα φυλάσσει και θα διατηρεί στη σημερινή κατοικία του L.S. το αργότερο έως την 31^η Δεκεμβρίου 2022. Την ημερομηνία αυτή, το μεγάλο ειδώλω θα παραδοθεί στο ΜΕΤ με την καθοδήγηση του HACI και τη μέριμνα, ευθύνη και δαπάνη του ΜΕΤ. Από τις αντίστοιχες ημερομηνίες που η Συλλογή και το μεγάλο ειδώλω θα παραδοθούν στο ΜΕΤ, το ΜΕΤ θα είναι υπεύθυνο για την ασφάλιση και ασφάλειά τους.

β.Το αργότερο έως την 15° Οκτωβρίου 2022, οι αρχαιότητες που προσδιορίζονται στο Παράρτημα Δ΄, το οποίο επισυνάπτεται στην παρούσα συμφωνία, θα αποσταλούν στο Κυκλαδικό Μουσείο, με την καθοδήγηση του HACI και με μέριμνα και δαπάνη του ΜΕΤ, προκειμένου να εκτεθούν για διάστημα ενός έτους, από την 1η Νοεμβρίου 2022 έως και την 31η Οκτωβρίου 2023 σε ειδικά διαμορφωμένο χώρο του Κυκλαδικού Μουσείου, κατάλληλο για την ανάδειξη και προστασία τους. Μετά το πέρας αυτής της ετήσιας περιόδου και πάντως όχι αργότερα από την 10^η Νοεμβρίου 2023, οι αρχαιότητες θα αποσταλούν στο ΜΕΤ με μέριμνα του Κυκλαδικού Μουσείου και δαπάνη του ΜΕΤ, προκειμένου να ξεκινήσει η έκθεση της Συλλογής στο ΜΕΤ, σύμφωνα με την Σύμβαση Έκθεσης. Σε περίπτωση μη συμμόρφωσης του ΜΕΤ προς το πρώτο εδάφιο της παρούσας παρ. 6β., ο HACI δύναται να προβεί στη δικαστική επιδίωξη της συμμόρφωσης του ΜΕΤ προς την υποχρέωσή του να στείλει τις δεκαπέντε (15) αρχαιότητες στο Κυκλαδικό Μουσείο, ενώπιον αρμόδιου δικαστηρίου της Νέας Υόρκης. Σε περίπτωση μη συμμόρφωσης του Κυκλαδικού Μουσείου ή άλλου προσώπου προς τις υποχρεώσεις του δευτέρου εδαφίου της παρούσας παρ. 6β. ο L.S., ως πρόσωπο εκ τρίτου δικαιούμενο από τη Συμφωνία Έκθεσης και την παρούσα συμφωνία, δύναται να προβεί στη δικαστική επιδίωξη της συμμόρφωσης προς τις υποχρεώσεις αυτές ενώπιον αρμόδιου δικαστηρίου της Νέας Υόρκης.

γ. Η Συλλογή θα εκτεθεί σε αίθουσα στο ΜΕΤ για είκοσι πέντε (25) έτη, με έναρξη μεταξύ της 1^{ης} και, το αργότερο, της 29^{ης} Ιανουαρίου 2024 και θα διαρκέσει έως την 31^η Δεκεμβρίου 2048, ως ακολούθως:

-μεταξύ της 1^{nc} και, το αργότερο, της 29^{nc} Ιανουαρίου 2024 και έως την 31^n Δεκεμβρίου 2033 η Συλλογή θα εκτίθεται στο σύνολό της (161 αρχαιότητες),

-ανά πενταετία, μετά το τέλος της ως άνω δεκαετούς περιόδου έκθεσης και συγκεκριμένα την 1^η Ιανουαρίου των ετών 2034, 2039 και 2044, δέκα πέντε (15) αρχαιότητες της Συλλογής (και συνολικά 45 αρχαιότητες) θα επιστρέφονται στον HACI, προκειμένου να εκτεθούν στο Κυκλαδικό Μουσείο και/ή σε άλλα μουσεία της Ελλάδας, όπως θα υποδεικνύει κάθε φορά το Διοικητικό Συμβούλιο του HACI και θα εγκρίνει το Υπουργείο, σύμφωνα με τους νόμους της Ελληνικής Δημοκρατίας περί προστασίας της πολιτιστικής κληρονομιάς, Αυτές οι αρχαιότητες θα επιλέγονται από το Υπουργείο σε συνεννόηση με το Κυκλαδικό Μουσείο και το ΜΕΤ, κατά συνεκτίμηση, μεταξύ άλλων, των τύπων που δεν εκπροσωπούνται στη συλλογή του Κυκλαδικού Μουσείου και των άλλων μουσείων στην Ελλάδα. Το μεγάλο ειδώλιο (αρ. τεμαχίου 105) θα περιληφθεί στις δεκαπέντε (15) αρχαιότητες που θα επιστραφούν στην

κατοχή του HACI την 1^η Ιανουαρίου 2034. Η σειρά με την οποία θα επιστρέφονται οι αρχαιότητες αυτές στον HACI θα εγκρίνεται από το MET.

δ. Προς το σκοπό της διατήρησης της ανάδειξης της Κυκλαδικής τέχνης στο ΜΕΤ, υποχρεούται αυτό να εκθέτει στην ίδια αίθουσα όπου εκτίθεται η Συλλογή, αρχαιότητες του Κυκλαδικού Πολιτισμού από τις συλλογές του Κυκλαδικού Μουσείου και/ή άλλων μουσείων στην Ελλάδα, τις οποίες το Ελληνικό Κράτος θα πρέπει να στέλνει στο ΜΕΤ ως δάνειο. Οι αρχαιότητες αυτές θα επιλέγονται από το Υπουργείο σε συνεννόηση με το Κυκλαδικό Μουσείο, κατά συνεκτίμηση, μεταξύ άλλων, των τύπων των αρχαιοτήτων που δεν εκπροσωπούνται στη Συλλογή, θα έχουν αντίστοιχη αξία και σημαντικότητα με τις αρχαιότητες που αποστέλλονται για έκθεση στο Κυκλαδικό Μουσείο σύμφωνα με την παρ. 6γ., θα εγκρίνονται από το Κυκλαδικό Μουσείο και το ΜΕΤ και θα αποστέλλονται στο ΜΕΤ ως εξής:

-δέκα πέντε (15) αρχαιότητες για το διάστημα από την 1^η Ιανουαρίου 2034 έως την 31^η Δεκεμβρίου 2048 (δανεισμός 15ετούς διάρκειας),

-δέκα πέντε (15) αρχαιότητες για το διάστημα από την 1º Ιανουαρίου 2039 έως την 31º Δεκεμβρίου 2048 (δανεισμός δεκαετούς διάρκειας) και

-δέκα πέντε (15) αρχαιότητες για το διάστημα από την 1º Ιανουαρίου 2044 έως την 31º Δεκεμβρίου 2048 (δανεισμός πενταετούς διάρκειας).

ε. Η έκθεση της Συλλογής, καθώς και όλες οι μετακινήσεις των αρχαιοτήτων που αναφέρονται στις προηγούμενες παραγράφους θα διενεργούνται με μέριμνα και δαπάνη του ΜΕΤ.

στ. Για το διάστημα από την 1º Ιανουαρίου 2049 και εφεξής, το ΜΕΤ θα έχει υποχρέωση να συνεχίσει να προβάλλει την Κυκλαδική τέχνη για επιπλέον διάστημα έως είκοσι πέντε (25) ετών, ως εξής:

Μετά την 1^n Ιανουαρίου 2049, το Ελληνικό Κράτος δύναται, κατά την απόλυτη ευχέρειά του, να συμφωνήσει με το ΜΕΤ δανεισμό της Συλλογής για χρονική περίοδο που δεν θα υπερβαίνει τα είκοσι πέντε (25) έτη. Αν δεν καταρτιστεί τέτοια συμφωνία

- η έκθεση της Συλλογής, δυνάμει της Σύμβασης Έκθεσης θα λήξει.

-οι αρχαιότητες της Συλλογής που θα ευρίσκονται τότε στην Ελλάδα θα εκτεθούν στο Κυκλαδικό Μουσείο και/ή σε άλλα μουσεία της Ελλάδας, όπως θα υποδείξει το Διοικητικό Συμβούλιο του HACI και θα εγκρίνει το Υπουργείο σύμφωνα με τους νόμους της Ελληνικής Δημοκρατίας σχετικά με την πολιτιστική κληρονομιά.

-η κατοχή οποιωνδήποτε αρχαιοτήτων θα ευρίσκονται τότε στο ΜΕΤ θα επιστρέψει στον ΗΑCΙ και θα αποσταλούν άμεσα για να εκτεθούν μόνιμα στο Κυκλαδικό Μουσείο και/ή σε άλλα μουσεία της Ελλάδας, όπως θα υποδείξει το Διοικητικό Συμβούλιο του ΗΑCΙ και θα εγκρίνει το Υπουργείο σύμφωνα με τους νόμους της Ελληνικής Δημοκρατίας σχετικά με την πολιτιστική κληρονομιά με ίση δαπάνη του Ελληνικού Κράτους και του Κυκλαδικού Μουσείου. Σε περίπτωση που ο ΗΑCΙ ευρίσκεται τότε σε νομική ή άλλη αδυναμία να παραλάβει ή να καθοδηγήσει την κατοχή, οι αρχαιότητες θα αποσταλούν στο Κυκλαδικό Μουσείο με την καθοδήγηση και μέριμνα του ΜΕΓ και με ίση δαπάνη μεταξύ του Ελληνικού Κράτους και του Κυκλαδικού Μουσείου.

Annex A: Contribution Agreement

CONTRIBUTION AGREEMENT

This CONTRIBUTION AGREEMENT entered into on this 21ST day of July, 2022, between LEONARD N. STERN ("Stern") and the HELLENIC ANCIENT CULTURE INSTITUTE, INC. ("HACI"):

WHEREAS, HACI is a not-for-profit corporation organized in the State of Delaware and operating in the State of New York, which has received tax-exempt status under Sections 501(a), 501(c)(3), and 509(a)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code"), for the purpose of carrying out the charitable and educational purposes and activities of the Nicholas and Dolly Goulandris Foundation - Museum of Cycladic Art, located in Athens; and;

WHEREAS, Stern has accumulated an extraordinary collection of Cycladic antiquities, consisting of 161 pieces, listed in Exhibit A hereto, representing one of the world's great sculptural traditions (the "Collection"); and

WHEREAS, Stern has agreed to contribute to HACI his rights and interests in the entire Collection, including his right of possession, subject to rescission of the contribution if certain conditions are not satisfied prior to the dates set out below; and

WHEREAS, HACI has evidenced its desire to receive the Collection and has agreed to utilize said Collection solely in concert with its charitable and educational purposes referenced above, but subject to rescission of the contribution and return of the Collection to Stern if the below-referenced conditions are not satisfied prior to the respective dates; and

WHEREAS, HACI will enter into an agreement with the Metropolitan Museum of Art in New York, New York (the "MET") for display of the Collection at the MET, identical to the agreement attached hereto as Exhibit B (the "Exhibition Agreement") after the full execution of this Contribution Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, to carry out their desires and intentions as indicated above, Stern and HACI hereby agree, Paragraph 1 being subject to the post-contribution conditions listed in Paragraph 2. below, as follows:

- 1. Stern hereby contributes his rights and interests in the Collection, including his right of possession, to HACI, and HACI hereby accepts the contribution and possession of the Collection from Stern, with the transfer of all of Stern's right and interest in and to the Collection to HACI being effectuated by this Contribution Agreement without the need of a separate assignment document.
- 2. It is hereby agreed that Stern's contribution of the Collection to HACI shall be rescinded and his rights and interests in the Collection including his right of possession in the Collection in its entirety shall be delivered to Stern at his expense, if the following events do not occur prior to the dates set out below:
- A. No later than July 21, 2022, HACI and the MET will have entered into the Exhibition Agreement establishing HACI's obligation to have the Collection displayed at the MET for not less than 25 years and not more than 50 years, and the MET's agreement to exhibit the Collection throughout the term of the display at the MET.

- B. No later than September 10, 2022, Stern, HACI and the MET shall have received formal approval from the Greek State in form and substance according to the Greek law (including, but not limited to, publication in the Government's Official Gazette) and reasonably acceptable to each of them of the contribution and display transactions evidenced by this Contribution Agreement and the Exhibition Agreement.
- 3. This Contribution Agreement is subject only to the afore-mentioned conditions, which cannot be expanded by either party by way of interpretation, and upon fulfillment of said conditions this Contribution Agreement becomes irrevocable.
- 4. Neither Stern nor HACI can change the terms of this Contribution Agreement without the written approval of the other signatory hereto.
- 5. This Contribution Agreement and any amendment hereto may be signed in any number of counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, but all of which taken together shall constitute one agreement (or amendment, as applicable).
- 6. The exchange of counterparts of this Contribution Agreement between the parties by means of facsimile transmission or by electronic email transmission (pdf) which shall contain authentic reproductions shall constitute a valid exchange of this Contribution Agreement and shall be binding upon the parties hereto.
- 7. This Contribution Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of New York. The parties hereto hereby irrevocably agree that any legal action or proceeding arising out of or relating to this Contribution Agreement may be brought in the Courts of the State of New York, or the Federal District Court for the Southern (00833923-1)

District of New York, as either such party may elect. By execution and delivery of this Contribution Agreement, each of the parties hereto hereby irrevocably accepts and submits generally and unconditionally for itself and with respect to its properties, to the jurisdiction of any such court in any such action or proceeding, and hereby waives in the case of any such action or proceeding brought in the courts of the State of New York, or Federal District Court for the Southern District of New York, any defenses based on jurisdiction, venue or forum non conveniens.

Exhibit B: Exhibition Agreement

EXHIBITION AGREEMENT

entered into on this 21st day of July, 2022

Between

The Hellenic Ancient Culture Institute, Inc. (hereinafter "HACI"), c/o Roberts & Holland LLP, 1675 Broadway, New York, New York 10019, United States, represented by its Secretary, Peter John Goulandris,

and

The Metropolitan Museum of Art, 1000 Fifth Avenue, New York, New York, 10028, United States (hereafter the "MET") represented by Max Hollein, Maria Kellen French Director.

HACI and the MET are hereafter referred to singularly as a "Party" and collectively as the "Parties".

Whereas

- A. Leonard N. Stern ("Mr. Stern") has accumulated an extraordinary collection of Cycladic antiquities consisting of 161 pieces representing one of the world's great sculptural traditions (the collection of 161 pieces hereinafter referred to as the "Collection;" a listing of the pieces in the Collection is annexed hereto as Exhibit A); the Collection exists as a result of Mr. Stern's long-standing interest in not only Cycladic art but other art and artifacts of the Hellenic Republic and in the history of Greek Culture;
- B. Mr. Stern wishes to share the Collection with fellow New Yorkers and with the world through display of the Collection at the MET, which already has a significant collection of Greek art and artifacts on display;
- C. To that end, Mr. Stern entered into that certain Contribution Agreement with HACI on even date hereof, a copy of which is attached hereto, whereby Mr. Stern contributed all 161 antiquities from the Collection to HACI, subject to rescission of the contribution if either of two contemplated events described below does not happen before September 10, 2022;
- D. HACI hereby agrees to have the Collection exhibited at the MET, and to take any and all actions to ensure and guarantee the implementation of an exchange arrangement as described hereinbelow in accordance with this Agreement, its Articles of Incorporation and the Greek Patrimony Law;
- E. The MET agrees to prominently display the Collection in a dedicated gallery space to be built specifically for the entire Collection and to publish a catalog of the Collection; and
- F. Recognizing the importance of displaying Cycladic artwork in New York for the duration of

approval of the Greek State in accordance with this Agreement, HACI's Articles of Incorporation and the Greek Patrimony Law;

The Parties hereby agree as follows:

1. Recitals

The preceding recitals form an integral part of this Agreement.

2. Contribution of Collection to HACI

Mr. Stern has contributed the Collection to HACI, subject to the post-contribution conditions set forth in the Contribution Agreement between Mr. Stern and HACI, i.e., that this Agreement has been executed by the Parties no later than July 21, 2022, and that that certain 4-party Agreement by and among the Ministry of Culture and Sport of the Hellenic Republic (the "Ministry"), HACI, the MET, and the Museum of Cycladic Art of Athens (the "Museum") dated July 21, 2022 has been formally approved by the Greek State (including publication in the Government's Official Gazette) no later than September 10, 2022.

3. HACI's Obligation to Display the Collection at the MET

Upon Mr. Stern's contribution of the Collection to HACI, HACI will have the Collection exhibited at the MET ("the Exhibition") as set forth in this Agreement.

4. MET's display of the Collection

The MET will install a new gallery space (the "Gallery Space") dedicated to the display of the Collection, to be completed in an expeditious manner upon execution of this Agreement.

6. Recognition of Mr. Stern

The MET will celebrate Mr. Stern's generosity, and the collaboration among the Parties and Mr. Stern, by hosting an opening reception at the MET on or prior to the opening of the exhibition (the "Exhibition Opening").

7. Timetable for Exhibition

- A. <u>Initial Phase</u>. Upon and subject to formal approval of the Contribution and Exhibition Agreements by the Greek Parliament prior to September 10, 2022, the following events will occur:
 - (i) Initially, HACI will keep and maintain the entire Collection at Mr. Stern's present residence during which time Mr. Stern will be responsible for the Collection's security and insurance;
 - (ii) By September 30, 2022, with the exception of the large idol (#105), the Collection will be delivered to the MET at the direction of HACI and at the care, responsibility and expense of the MET. The largest idol will be delivered to the MET on or before December 31, 2022. From the dates the Collection and the large idol are delivered to the MET, the MET will be responsible for their insurance and security.
- B. No later than October 15, 2022, the MET will deliver 15 Collection works, listed on Exhibit B hereto, to the Museum. Said 15 Collection Works will be exhibited for a period not to exceed one (1) year, from November 1, 2022 through October 31, 2023, in an appropriately designed space in the Museum suitable for their display and protection. At the end of said one-year period, or on or prior to November 10, 2023, the 15 Collection works must and shall be delivered by the Museum and HACI for installation at the MET. The remaining 146 works in the Collection shall remain at the MET for conservation and study prior to the installation of the Collection for the Exhibition Opening, currently planned for a date between January 1, 2024 and January 29, 2024. In the event the MET fails to comply with the first sentence of this Section 7.B., HACI will be entitled to pursue legal action in an appropriate court in the State of New York for the enforcement of the obligation to send the 15 Collection works to the Museum. Any failure of the Museum or HACI, as the case may be, to deliver the 15 Collection works to the MET in a timely manner as required pursuant to this Section 7.B. will entitle Mr. Stern (or his designee), as a third-party beneficiary of this Exhibition Agreement, to pursue legal action in the appropriate court in the State of New York to compel specific performance of the obligation to deliver the 15 Collection works to the MET.
- C. <u>Following Ten Years</u>. The MET agrees to display in the Gallery Space all of the Collection works for a ten-year period commencing between January 1, 2024 and January 29, 2024 and ending on December 31, 2033.

D. Series of Exchanges for following 15 years.

1. Years 11-15. From January 1, 2034 until December 31, 2038, the MET shall retain no fewer than 146 Collection works, and transfer the remaining 15 Collection works to be displayed at the Museum and/or any such other museums in Greece, as HACI's Board of Directors will each time indicate in accordance with the laws of the Hellenic Republic on cultural heritage and HACI's Articles of Incorporation. HACI and the MET are entitled to decide on issues regarding the selection of the Collection works, ensuring a balanced representation of the Collection; in exchange,

the 15 works removed from the MET will be replaced under the responsibility of HACI, with an equal number of pieces of Cycladic art from Greece of equal significance and beauty as the works of the Collection, to be delivered to the MET under the responsibility of HACI in accordance with the Greek Patrimony Law, and approved by the MET, through a loan to the MET for fifteen (15) years ending December 31, 2048.

- 2. Years 16-20. From January 1, 2039 until December 31, 2043, the MET shall retain no fewer than 131 Collection works, and transfer the remaining 15 Collection works to be displayed at the Museum and/or any such other museums in Greece, as HACI's Board of Directors will each time indicate in accordance with the laws of the Hellenic Republic on cultural heritage and HACI's Articles of Incorporation. HACI and the MET are entitled to decide on issues regarding the selection of the Collection works, ensuring a balanced representation of the Collection; in exchange, the 15 works removed from the MET will be replaced under the responsibility of HACI, with an equal number of pieces of Cycladic art from Greece of equal significance and beauty as the works of the Collection, to be delivered to the MET under the responsibility of HACI in accordance with the Greek Patrimony Law, and approved by the MET, through a loan to the MET for ten (10) years ending December 31, 2048.
- 3. Years 21-25. From January 1, 2044 until December 31, 2048, the MET shall retain no fewer than 116 Collection works, and transfer the remaining 15 Collection works to be displayed at the Museum and/or any such other museums in Greece, as HACI's Board of Directors will each time indicate in accordance with the laws of the Hellenic Republic on cultural heritage and HACI's Articles of Incorporation. HACI and the MET are entitled to decide on issues regarding the selection of the Collection works, ensuring a balanced representation of the Collection; in exchange, the 15 works removed from the MET will be replaced under the responsibility of HACI, with an equal number of pieces of Cycladic art from Greece of equal significance and beauty as the works of the Collection, to be delivered to the MET under the responsibility of HACI in accordance with the Greek Patrimony Law, and approved by the MET, through a loan to the MET for five (5) years ending December 31, 2048.

E. Next 25 Years

- 1. For the purpose of maintaining a major installation of Cycladic art at the MET for a period of 50 years, HACI, undertakes to take any and all actions and guarantee the display of 122 or more works of Cycladic art at the MET from January 1, 2049 and continuing for a period of 25 years in accordance with the Greek Patrimony Law, as follows:
 - (i) by entering into a loan to the MET regarding the Collection in whole or in part, or
 - (ii) by requesting the remaining Collection works be shipped to Greece and in exchange making loans to the MET of 122 pieces of Cycladic art of equal significance and beauty to

the Collection. The Cycladic art pieces to be lent through replacement loans will be selected by HACI in accordance with the Greek Patrimony Law in consultation with the MET and approved by the Museum and the MET.

8. Enforcement of Mr. Stern's Interests

Mr. Stern and/or any specifically authorized officer of The Leonard Stern Family Foundation is empowered to review the actions of the Parties as set forth in this Agreement and to enforce this Agreement and every provision of it, including any aspect of the 4-party Agreement entered into by the Ministry that is approved by the Greek State and that entitles Mr. Stern to take certain actions under the circumstances specified therein, it being acknowledged and agreed that Mr. Stern and The Leonard Stern Family Foundation are third party beneficiaries of this Agreement, having relied upon the provisions of this Agreement in Mr. Stern contributing the Collection to HACI.

9. Costs of shipping and insurance

- A. The MET shall make the shipping arrangements and bear the shipping costs of the Initial Phase Exhibition (paragraphs 7.A and B), the Initial Ten-Year Period and the three exchange transactions described above over the following 15 years; except at the termination of the Collection exhibition, HACI shall bear the cost of shipping the 116 or more remaining Collection works to Greece.
- B. The MET will insure the Collection while on site there and while works are in transit to and from the MET and museums designated by HACI. HACI shall be responsible for insuring the Collection works at museums designated by HACI.
- C. For the period January 1, 2049 through December 31, 2073, the parties shall agree to the distribution of associated costs and insurance responsibilities as an element of the loan agreements relative to that time period.

10. Conditions of Exhibition

HACI and the MET agree that the Exhibition will adhere to the MET's standard conditions of loan, attached hereto as Exhibit C. Further, HACI and the MET recognize that loan standards and conditions may evolve over time, and therefore agree to review the Museum's standard conditions of loan every ten years so that the understanding between the Parties remains current.

12. Complete Agreement

Except as otherwise set forth herein, this Agreement contains all agreements entered into between the Parties hereunder, and will be effective on July 21, 2022.

13. Counterparts

This Exhibition Agreement and any amendment hereto may be signed in any number of counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, but all of which taken together shall constitute one agreement (or amendment, as applicable).

14. Electronic Signatures/Counterparts

The exchange of counterparts of this Exhibition Agreement between the parties by means of facsimile transmission or by electronic email transmission (pdf) which shall contain authentic reproductions shall constitute a valid exchange of this Exhibition Agreement and shall be binding upon the parties hereto.

15. Law and Jurisdiction

Without prejudice to clause 8 of the 4-party Agreement, this Exhibition Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of New York. The parties hereto hereby irrevocably agree that any legal action or proceeding arising out of or relating to this Exhibition Agreement may be brought in the Courts of the State of New York, or the Federal District Court for the Southern District of New York, as either such party may elect. By execution and delivery of this Exhibition Agreement, each of the parties hereto hereby irrevocably accepts and submits generally and unconditionally for itself and with respect to its properties, to the jurisdiction of any such court in any such action or proceeding, and hereby waives in the case of any such action or proceeding brought in the courts of the State of New York, or Federal District Court for the Southern District of New York, any defenses based on jurisdiction, venue or forum non conveniens.

Annex C: Exhibition Agreement

EXHIBITION AGREEMENT

entered into on this 21st day of July, 2022

Between

The Hellenic Ancient Culture Institute, Inc. (hereinafter "HACI"), c/o Roberts & Holland LLP, 1675 Broadway, New York, New York 10019, United States, represented by its Secretary, Peter John Goulandris,

and

The Metropolitan Museum of Art, 1000 Fifth Avenue, New York, New York, 10028, United States (hereafter the "MET") represented by Max Hollein, Maria Kellen French Director.

HACI and the MET are hereafter referred to singularly as a "Party" and collectively as the "Parties".

Whereas

- A. Leonard N. Stern ("Mr. Stern") has accumulated an extraordinary collection of Cycladic antiquities consisting of 161 pieces representing one of the world's great sculptural traditions (the collection of 161 pieces hereinafter referred to as the "Collection;" a listing of the pieces in the Collection is annexed hereto as Exhibit A); the Collection exists as a result of Mr. Stern's long-standing interest in not only Cycladic art but other art and artifacts of the Hellenic Republic and in the history of Greek Culture;
- B. Mr. Stern wishes to share the Collection with fellow New Yorkers and with the world through display of the Collection at the MET, which already has a significant collection of Greek art and artifacts on display;
- C. To that end, Mr. Stern entered into that certain Contribution Agreement with HACI on even date hereof, a copy of which is attached hereto, whereby Mr. Stern contributed all 161 antiquities from the Collection to HACI, subject to rescission of the contribution if either of two contemplated events described below does not happen before September 10, 2022;
- D. HACI hereby agrees to have the Collection exhibited at the MET, and to take any and all actions to ensure and guarantee the implementation of an exchange arrangement as described hereinbelow in accordance with this Agreement, its Articles of Incorporation and the Greek Patrimony Law;
- E. The MET agrees to prominently display the Collection in a dedicated gallery space to be built specifically for the entire Collection and to publish a catalog of the Collection; and
- F. Recognizing the importance of displaying Cycladic artwork in New York for the duration of

approval of the Greek State in accordance with this Agreement, HACI's Articles of Incorporation and the Greek Patrimony Law;

The Parties hereby agree as follows:

1. Recitals

The preceding recitals form an integral part of this Agreement.

2. Contribution of Collection to HACI

Mr. Stern has contributed the Collection to HACI, subject to the post-contribution conditions set forth in the Contribution Agreement between Mr. Stern and HACI, i.e., that this Agreement has been executed by the Parties no later than July 21, 2022, and that that certain 4-party Agreement by and among the Ministry of Culture and Sport of the Hellenic Republic (the "Ministry"), HACI, the MET, and the Museum of Cycladic Art of Athens (the "Museum") dated July 21, 2022 has been formally approved by the Greek State (including publication in the Government's Official Gazette) no later than September 10, 2022.

3. HACI's Obligation to Display the Collection at the MET

Upon Mr. Stern's contribution of the Collection to HACI, HACI will have the Collection exhibited at the MET ("the Exhibition") as set forth in this Agreement.

4. MET's display of the Collection

The MET will install a new gallery space (the "Gallery Space") dedicated to the display of the Collection, to be completed in an expeditious manner upon execution of this Agreement.

6. Recognition of Mr. Stern

The MET will celebrate Mr. Stern's generosity, and the collaboration among the Parties and Mr. Stern, by hosting an opening reception at the MET on or prior to the opening of the exhibition (the "Exhibition Opening").

7. Timetable for Exhibition

- A. <u>Initial Phase</u>. Upon and subject to formal approval of the Contribution and Exhibition Agreements by the Greek Parliament prior to September 10, 2022, the following events will occur:
 - (i) Initially, HACI will keep and maintain the entire Collection at Mr. Stern's present residence during which time Mr. Stern will be responsible for the Collection's security and insurance;
 - (ii) By September 30, 2022, with the exception of the large idol (#105), the Collection will be delivered to the MET at the direction of HACI and at the care, responsibility and expense of the MET. The largest idol will be delivered to the MET on or before December 31, 2022. From the dates the Collection and the large idol are delivered to the MET, the MET will be responsible for their insurance and security.
- B. No later than October 15, 2022, the MET will deliver 15 Collection works, listed on Exhibit B hereto, to the Museum. Said 15 Collection Works will be exhibited for a period not to exceed one (1) year, from November 1, 2022 through October 31, 2023, in an appropriately designed space in the Museum suitable for their display and protection. At the end of said one-year period, or on or prior to November 10, 2023, the 15 Collection works must and shall be delivered by the Museum and HACI for installation at the MET. The remaining 146 works in the Collection shall remain at the MET for conservation and study prior to the installation of the Collection for the Exhibition Opening, currently planned for a date between January 1, 2024 and January 29, 2024. In the event the MET fails to comply with the first sentence of this Section 7.B., HACI will be entitled to pursue legal action in an appropriate court in the State of New York for the enforcement of the obligation to send the 15 Collection works to the Museum. Any failure of the Museum or HACI, as the case may be, to deliver the 15 Collection works to the MET in a timely manner as required pursuant to this Section 7.B. will entitle Mr. Stern (or his designee), as a third-party beneficiary of this Exhibition Agreement, to pursue legal action in the appropriate court in the State of New York to compel specific performance of the obligation to deliver the 15 Collection works to the MET.
- C. <u>Following Ten Years</u>. The MET agrees to display in the Gallery Space all of the Collection works for a ten-year period commencing between January 1, 2024 and January 29, 2024 and ending on December 31, 2033.

D. Series of Exchanges for following 15 years.

1. Years 11-15. From January 1, 2034 until December 31, 2038, the MET shall retain no fewer than 146 Collection works, and transfer the remaining 15 Collection works to be displayed at the Museum and/or any such other museums in Greece, as HACI's Board of Directors will each time indicate in accordance with the laws of the Hellenic Republic on cultural heritage and HACI's Articles of Incorporation. HACI and the MET are entitled to decide on issues regarding the selection of the Collection works, ensuring a balanced representation of the Collection; in exchange,

the 15 works removed from the MET will be replaced under the responsibility of HACI, with an equal number of pieces of Cycladic art from Greece of equal significance and beauty as the works of the Collection, to be delivered to the MET under the responsibility of HACI in accordance with the Greek Patrimony Law, and approved by the MET, through a loan to the MET for fifteen (15) years ending December 31, 2048.

- 2. Years 16-20. From January 1, 2039 until December 31, 2043, the MET shall retain no fewer than 131 Collection works, and transfer the remaining 15 Collection works to be displayed at the Museum and/or any such other museums in Greece, as HACI's Board of Directors will each time indicate in accordance with the laws of the Hellenic Republic on cultural heritage and HACI's Articles of Incorporation. HACI and the MET are entitled to decide on issues regarding the selection of the Collection works, ensuring a balanced representation of the Collection; in exchange, the 15 works removed from the MET will be replaced under the responsibility of HACI, with an equal number of pieces of Cycladic art from Greece of equal significance and beauty as the works of the Collection, to be delivered to the MET under the responsibility of HACI in accordance with the Greek Patrimony Law, and approved by the MET, through a loan to the MET for ten (10) years ending December 31, 2048.
- 3. Years 21-25. From January 1, 2044 until December 31, 2048, the MET shall retain no fewer than 116 Collection works, and transfer the remaining 15 Collection works to be displayed at the Museum and/or any such other museums in Greece, as HACI's Board of Directors will each time indicate in accordance with the laws of the Hellenic Republic on cultural heritage and HACI's Articles of Incorporation. HACI and the MET are entitled to decide on issues regarding the selection of the Collection works, ensuring a balanced representation of the Collection; in exchange, the 15 works removed from the MET will be replaced under the responsibility of HACI, with an equal number of pieces of Cycladic art from Greece of equal significance and beauty as the works of the Collection, to be delivered to the MET under the responsibility of HACI in accordance with the Greek Patrimony Law, and approved by the MET, through a loan to the MET for five (5) years ending December 31, 2048.

E. Next 25 Years

- 1. For the purpose of maintaining a major installation of Cycladic art at the MET for a period of 50 years, HACI, undertakes to take any and all actions and guarantee the display of 122 or more works of Cycladic art at the MET from January 1, 2049 and continuing for a period of 25 years in accordance with the Greek Patrimony Law, as follows:
 - (i) by entering into a loan to the MET regarding the Collection in whole or in part, or
 - (ii) by requesting the remaining Collection works be shipped to Greece and in exchange making loans to the MET of 122 pieces of Cycladic art of equal significance and beauty to

the Collection. The Cycladic art pieces to be lent through replacement loans will be selected by HACI in accordance with the Greek Patrimony Law in consultation with the MET and approved by the Museum and the MET.

8. Enforcement of Mr. Stern's Interests

Mr. Stern and/or any specifically authorized officer of The Leonard Stern Family Foundation is empowered to review the actions of the Parties as set forth in this Agreement and to enforce this Agreement and every provision of it, including any aspect of the 4-party Agreement entered into by the Ministry that is approved by the Greek State and that entitles Mr. Stern to take certain actions under the circumstances specified therein, it being acknowledged and agreed that Mr. Stern and The Leonard Stern Family Foundation are third party beneficiaries of this Agreement, having relied upon the provisions of this Agreement in Mr. Stern contributing the Collection to HACI.

9. Costs of shipping and insurance

- A. The MET shall make the shipping arrangements and bear the shipping costs of the Initial Phase Exhibition (paragraphs 7.A and B), the Initial Ten-Year Period and the three exchange transactions described above over the following 15 years; except at the termination of the Collection exhibition, HACI shall bear the cost of shipping the 116 or more remaining Collection works to Greece.
- B. The MET will insure the Collection while on site there and while works are in transit to and from the MET and museums designated by HACI. HACI shall be responsible for insuring the Collection works at museums designated by HACI.
- C. For the period January 1, 2049 through December 31, 2073, the parties shall agree to the distribution of associated costs and insurance responsibilities as an element of the loan agreements relative to that time period.

10. Conditions of Exhibition

HACI and the MET agree that the Exhibition will adhere to the MET's standard conditions of loan, attached hereto as Exhibit C. Further, HACI and the MET recognize that loan standards and conditions may evolve over time, and therefore agree to review the Museum's standard conditions of loan every ten years so that the understanding between the Parties remains current.

11. Credit Lines

Collection works will be displayed at the MET with the following credit lines:

Leonard N. Stern Collection (on the wall above the Collection Gallery)

Hellenic Republic-Ministry of Culture and Sports Museum of Cycladic Art-Athens Loan of Cycladic Art to the MET (all on the wall adjacent to the Collection)

12. Complete Agreement

Except as otherwise set forth herein, this Agreement contains all agreements entered into between the Parties hereunder, and will be effective on July 21, 2022.

13. Counterparts

This Exhibition Agreement and any amendment hereto may be signed in any number of counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, but all of which taken together shall constitute one agreement (or amendment, as applicable).

14. Electronic Signatures/Counterparts

15. Law and Jurisdiction

Without prejudice to clause 8 of the 4-party Agreement, this Exhibition Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of New York. The parties hereto hereby irrevocably agree that any legal action or proceeding arising out of or relating to this Exhibition Agreement may be brought in the Courts of the State of New York, or the Federal District Court for the Southern District of New York, as either such party may elect. By execution and delivery of this Exhibition Agreement, each of the parties hereto hereby irrevocably accepts and submits generally and unconditionally for itself and with respect to its properties, to the jurisdiction of any such court in any such action or proceeding, and hereby waives in the case of any such action or proceeding brought in the courts of the State of New York, or Federal District Court for the Southern District of New York, any defenses based on jurisdiction, venue or forum non conveniens.

TAPAPTHMAE'

Στο πλαίσιο της παρούσας ιστορικής συνεργασίας μεταξύ της Ελληνικής Δημοκρατίας και του ΜΕΤ, το Υπουργείο, το ΜΕΤ και το Κυκλαδικό Μουσείο δεσμεύονται να συνεργαστούν για την προώθηση της μελέτης και της εκπαίδευσης σχετικά με την Κυκλαδική Τέχνη, ως ακολούθως:

- 1. Το ΜΕΤ θα εκδώσει, με δικές του δαπάνες, έναν πλήρη, μουσειακής ποιότητας Κατάλογο της Συλλογής. Οι συγγραφείς του καταλόγου θα περιλαμβάνουν δύο ειδικούς στην κυκλαδική τέχνη που θα επιλεγούν από το Υπουργείο, σε συνεννόηση με το ΜΕΤ. Ο κατάλογος θα περιλαμβάνει προλόγους από τον Υπουργό Πολιτισμού, τον Διευθυντή του Μετ και τον Πρόεδρο του Κυκλαδικού Μουσείου που υπογράφουν την παρούσα συμφωνία και τον L.S. Το ΜΕΤ θα δημοσιεύσει επίσης ψηφιακά τα έργα της Συλλογής.
- 2. Το Υπουργείο και το Κυκλαδικό Μουσείο θα εκδώσουν, έκαστος με δική του δαπάνη, πλήρεις, μουσειακής ποιότητας Καταλόγους της Συλλογής στην Ελληνική Γλώσσα, ένα έτος μετά την έκδοση του Καταλόγου του ΜΕΤ. Ο κατάλογος του Μουσείου θα είναι της αποδοχής του Υπουργείου. Οι Κατάλογοι θα περιλαμβάνουν προλόγους από τον Υπουργό Πολιτισμού, τον Διευθυντή του ΜΕΤ και τον Πρόεδρο του Κυκλαδικού Μουσείου που υπογράφουν την παρούσα συμφωνία και τον L.S..
- 3. Το Υπουργείο, το Met και το Κυκλαδικό Μουσείο Τέχνης θα συνάψουν το Μνημόνιο Συνεργασίας, το οποίο θα υπογραφεί έως την 31 Δεκεμβρίου 2022, το οποίο θα περιλαμβάνει τις ακόλουθες δράσεις, με την επιφύλαξη περαιτέρω συζητήσεων και χρηματοδότησης:
- (i) ίδρυση υποτροφίας από το MET για Έλληνες αρχαιολόγους σχετικά με τη μελέτη έργων Κυκλαδικής τέχνης. Η υποτροφία θα προκηρύσσεται κάθε τρία χρόνια.
- (ii) Παραγωγή μιας υψηλής ποιότητας εκπαιδευτικής αφήγησης ταινίας για το κοινό, τα σχολεία και τα πανεπιστήμια. Η αφήγηση θα βασίζεται σε πραγματικά αρχαιολογικά στοιχεία και θα περιλαμβάνει εικονική αναπαράσταση οικισμών και άλλου αρχαιολογικού υλικού του κυκλαδικού πολιτισμού, ενώ θα υποτιτλιστεί και στις δύο γλώσσες, ελληνικά και αγγλικά. Η ταινία θα μπορεί να χρησιμοποιηθεί στις ιστοσελίδες και να προβληθεί στην οθόνη της πινακοθήκης της συλλογής.
- (iii) συνεργασία στον τομέα της συντήρησης και της εκπαίδευσης στον τομέα των συνεδρίων, των υποτροφιών για σπουδές, των αρχαιολογικών εργασιών πεδίου, των περαιτέρω δημοσιεύσεων και του δημόσιου προγραμματισμού.

4. English Version of Four-Party Agreement

AGREEMENT FOR THE EXHIBITION OF CYCLADIC ANTIQUITIES AT THE METROPOLITAN MUSEUM OF ART, NEW YORK

In Athens on July 21, 2022, at the building located at 20 Bouboulinas Street, where the Ministry for Culture and Sport is housed,

BY AND BETWEEN

- (A) The Ministry of Culture and Sport of the Hellenic Republic, lawfully represented by the Minister of Culture and Sport, Ms. Styliani Mendoni (the "Ministry"),
- **(B)** the non-profit legal entity "HELLENIC ANCIENT CULTURE INSTITUTE, INC." of the State of Delaware in the United States of America (c/o Roberts & Holland LLP, 1675 Broadway, New York, New York 10019, United States), lawfully represented by its Secretary Mr. Peter John Goulandris, by virtue of Resolutions of its Board of Directors ("HACI"),
- **(C)** the legal entity governed by private law "MUSEUM OF CYCLADIC ART" of Athens (4 Neofytou Douka Str.), lawfully represented by the President of its Board of Directors, Ms. Kassandra Marinopoulou, by virtue of Resolutions of its Board of Directors (the "Cycladic Museum"), and
- **(D)** the non-profit legal entity "THE METROPOLITAN MUSEUM OF ART" of the State of New York in the United States of America (1000 Fifth Avenue, New York, New York, 10028, United States) (the "MET"), lawfully represented by its Director, Mr. Max Hollein, by virtue of Resolutions of its Board of Directors.

THE PARTIES

A.

AFTER CONSIDERING AND MUTUALLY ACKNOWLEDGING THE FOLLOWING:

1. HACI is a non-profit legal entity established in accordance with the Laws of its place of establishment and governed by a Board of Directors whose Chairman and majority of members are appointed by the Cycladic Museum. The purposes of HACI include (i) promoting the cultural heritage of Greece and stimulating global interest in and knowledge about Greek antiquities; (ii) obtaining, by way of donations, loans, or bequests, ownership and/or possession of works of art, objects, and monuments from Greece dating back to the period from prehistoric times to the Middle Ages and seeing to their safekeeping, study, and conservation of antiquities, being entitled to transfer them to the Cycladic Museum or other museums in Greece, under decisions adopted by its Board of Directors in accordance with the laws of the Hellenic Republic on cultural heritage; and (iii) exhibiting and seeing to the exhibition of works of art, objects, and monuments from Greece dating back to the period from prehistoric times to the Middle Ages in museums or other suitable venues where objects of Greek or other cultures or countries are exhibited or studied, under decisions adopted by its Board of Directors provided that the laws of the Hellenic Republic on cultural heritage are respected;

- **2.** On July 21, 2022, Leonard Stern, resident in the United States ("L.S.") and HACI, entered into an agreement in New York witnessed before a Notary Public, attached hereto as Annex A (the "Contribution Agreement"), by virtue of which L.S. delivered to HACI, by way of donation, all his rights and interests, including possessory rights, in a collection of 161 Cycladic antiquities held by L.S. and shown in Annex B attached hereto (the "Collection").
- 3. L.S. contributed the Collection to HACI under the following terms and framework:
- (a) HACI has already obtained from the competent tax authority [the United States Internal Revenue Service (IRS)] a determination letter dated July, 6th 2022, ruling that HACI is exempt from United States federal income tax under Section 501(a) as an organization described in Sections 501(c)(3) and 509(a)(3) of the 1986 Internal Revenue Code.
- (b) no later than July 21, 2022, HACI and MET shall have entered into an agreement regarding the display of the Collection at the MET, identical to the agreement (the "Exhibition Agreement") attached to the Contribution Agreement and reproduced here as Annex C;
- (c) immediately once condition under (b) above has been met, and in any case no later than September 10, 2022, the Greek State shall have approved officially in accordance with the Greek law (including publication in the Government's Official Gazette), HACI's right to possession of the Collection as well as the display of the Collection at the MET, as per the Exhibition Agreement;
- (d) once the conditions under (b) and (c) have been met, the Contribution Agreement will enter into full force, become irrevocable and binding on L.S. and HACI, without the need of any other separate document to that end. In case any of the conditions under (b), and (c) are not met, the Contribution Agreement and Exhibition Agreement will be overturned, L.S. HACI, and the Met will be held free of any and all of their obligations thereunder, and the right to possess the Collection will revert to L.S. at L.S.'s expense;
- 4. In New York, on July 21, 2022, HACI and the MET entered into the Exhibition Agreement, and, therefore, condition (b) under paragraph 3 is met.

B. HAVE AGREED AND MUTUALLY ACCEPTED THE FOLLOWING:

- **5.** The Ministry enters into this Agreement representing the Greek State. Greek Patrimony Law provides that the Greek State is the sole owner of the Collection.
- 6. The Ministry, representing the Greek State and being the competent authority for the protection of Greece's cultural heritage, hereby (i) acknowledges, solely for the purposes of the following paragraphs, that HACI obtained the right of possession of the Collection by virtue of the Contribution Agreement, which is valid in accordance with the N.Y. laws and (ii) approves the display of the Collection at the MET under the following conditions:
- (a) Until September 30, 2022 at the latest, HACI will keep and maintain the Collection at L.S.'s current residence and L.S. will be responsible for the Collection's security and insurance. Thereafter, the Collection will be delivered to the MET at the direction of HACI and at the care, responsibility and expense of the MET, except for the largest idol (item no 105), which HACI will keep and maintain in L.S.'s current residence until on or before December, 31

- 2022. On such date the large idol will be delivered to the MET at the direction of HACI and at the care, responsibility and expense of the MET. From the respective dates the Collection and the large idol are delivered to the MET, the latter is responsible for their insurance and security.
- (b) No later than October 15, 2022, the fifteen (15) antiquities determined in Annex D attached hereto, will be sent to the Cycladic Museum at the direction of HACl and at the care and expense of the MET to be exhibited for one year, from November 1, 2022 until October 31, 2023, in an appropriately designed space in the Cycladic Museum, suitable for their display and protection. At the termination of this one-year period and no later than November 10, 2023, the antiquities will be sent back to the MET at the care of the Cycladic Museum and at the expense of the MET, for the launching of the exhibition of the Collection at the MET, in accordance with the Exhibition Agreement. In the event the MET fails to comply with the first sentence of this par. 6(b), HACl will be entitled to pursue legal action in an appropriate court in New York for the enforcement of such obligation to send the fifteen (15) antiquities to the Cycladic Museum. Any failure of the Cycladic Museum or any other person to comply with its obligation under the second sentence of this par. 6(b) will entitle L.S., as a third-party beneficiary of the Exhibition Agreement and this agreement, to pursue legal action in an appropriate court in New York for specific performance of the obligation.
- (c) The Collection will be exhibited in a gallery at the MET for twenty-five (25) years starting on a date between January 1, 2024 and no later than January 29, 2024 until December 31, 2048, as follows:
- -the entire Collection (161 antiquities) will be exhibited from a date between January 1, 2024 and no later than January 29, 2024 until December 31, 2033,
- -every five years past the end of the aforesaid ten-year exhibition period, specifically on January 1, 2034, January 1, 2039 and January 1, 2044, fifteen (15) antiquities from the Collection (45 antiquities in total) will revert to HACI to be displayed at the Cycladic Museum and/or any such other museums in Greece, as HACI's Board of Directors will each time indicate and the Ministry will approve in accordance with the laws of the Hellenic Republic on cultural heritage. These antiquities will be selected by the Ministry in consultation with the Cycladic Museum and the MET considering, inter alia, the types that are not represented in the collection of the Cycladic Museum and other museums in Greece. The large idol (item no 105) will be included in the fifteen (15) antiquities to be reverted to HACI's possession on January 1, 2034. The order in which these antiquities will be reverted to HACI will be approved by the MET.
- d) For the purpose of maintaining the promotion of Cycladic art at the MET, the MET will be obligated to display in the same installation where the Collection is displayed, antiquities of Cycladic civilization from the collections of the Cycladic Museum and/or other museums in Greece that the Greek State will be obligated to send to the MET by way of loan. These antiquities will be selected by the Ministry in consultation with the Cycladic Museum considering, inter alia and if possible, the types of antiquities that are not already represented in the Collection, will be of equivalent value and significance as the antiquities sent for display at the Cycladic Museum as per previous par. 6(c), will be approved by the Cycladic Museum and the MET and will be sent to the MET, on loan, as follows:

⁻fifteen (15) antiquities for the period from January 1, 2034 until December 31, 2048 (15-year loan).

⁻fifteen (15) antiquities for the period from January 1, 2039 until December 31, 2048 (10-year loan),

-fifteen (15) antiquities for the period from January 1, 2044 until December 31, 2048 (5-year loan).

- **(e)** The exhibition of the Collection and the transportation of the antiquities referred to in the previous paragraphs will be implemented at the care of and at the expense of the MET.
- (f) As from January 1, 2049, the MET will be obliged to continue promoting Cycladic art for another period no longer that twenty-five (25) years as follows:

 After January 1, 2049 the Greek State may, at its absolute sole discretion, agree with the MET to loan the whole Collection for a period no longer than twenty-five (25) years. If no such agreement is accomplished,
- the Collection's display under the Exhibition Agreement will be terminated.
- the Collection's antiquities being at the time in Greece will be displayed at the Cycladic Museum and/or any such other museum in Greece, as HACI's Board of Directors will indicate and the Ministry will approve in accordance with the laws of the Hellenic Republic on cultural heritage.
- possession of any antiquities then being at the MET will revert definitively to HACI and be immediately dispatched at the equal expense of the Greek State and the Cycladic Museum to be permanently displayed at the Cycladic Museum and/or such other museum in Greece, as HACI's Board of Directors will indicate and the Ministry will approve in accordance with the laws of the Hellenic Republic on cultural heritage. In case HACI is at that time unable to receive or direct possession of the antiquities due to any legal or other reason, the antiquities will be sent to the Cycladic Museum at the direction and care of the MET and at the equal expense of the Greek State and the Cycladic Museum.
- the MET will be obligated to display at the same installation, one hundred twenty-two (122) antiquities of Cycladic civilization from the collections of the Cycladic Museum and/or other museums in Greece that the Greek State will be obligated to send to the MET by way of loan for a period of twenty-five (25) years and under such terms as the Greek State, the Cycladic Museum and the MET will then agree to. These antiquities will be selected by the Ministry in consultation with the MET and approved by the Cycladic Museum and the MET.
- (g) The gallery will prominently bear on a wall, the following indication regarding the Greek State:

HELLENIC REPUBLIC - MINISTRY OF CULTURE AND SPORTS MUSEUM OF CYCLADIC ART, ATHENS LOAN OF CYCLADIC ART TO THE MET

- (h) The Ministry, the Cycladic Museum and the MET agree to collaborate in the projects described in Annex E' attached to this agreement.
- **7.** Any and all agreements envisaged in this agreement and any and all related ancillary acts in connection with or amendments thereto will be exempted of any and all direct or indirect taxes, duties, contributory or otherwise, stamp duty, contributions, commissions, royalties or any other charge payable to the Greek State.
- **8.** Except as provided above, and specifically as provided in paragraph 6 (b) above, any and all disputes that may arise under this agreement will be resolved by the Courts of Athens pursuant to the laws of Greece.

- **9.** In case of conflicts or inconsistencies between this agreement and the Contribution Agreement and/or the Exhibition Agreement and/or their annexes, the terms of this agreement will prevail.
- **10.** The material failure by L.S. or the MET to comply with their obligations under the Contribution Agreement and/or the Exhibition Agreement and/or this agreement shall entitle the other parties to annul this agreement. Further, all terms of this agreement are declared important and equal.
- **11.** This agreement shall be submitted to and approved by the Greek Parliament no later than September **10**, **2022** (including publication in the Government's Official Gazette), and be effective as from the date of its execution.
- **12.** This agreement was drafted in both Greek and English and in case of conflict the Greek text supersedes, provided the same is substantially in accordance with the terms and conditions of the English version.
- **13**. This agreement and any amendment hereto may be signed in any number of counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, but all of which taken together shall constitute one agreement (or amendment, as applicable).
- 14. The exchange of counterparts of this agreement between the parties by means of facsimile transmission or by electronic email transmission (pdf) which shall contain authentic reproductions shall constitute a valid exchange of this Agreement and shall be binding upon the parties hereto.

Annex A: Contribution Agreement

CONTRIBUTION AGREEMENT

This CONTRIBUTION AGREEMENT entered into on this 21ST day of July, 2022, between LEONARD N. STERN ("Stern") and the HELLENIC ANCIENT CULTURE INSTITUTE, INC. ("HACI"):

WHEREAS, HACI is a not-for-profit corporation organized in the State of Delaware and operating in the State of New York, which has received tax-exempt status under Sections 501(a), 501(c)(3), and 509(a)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code"), for the purpose of carrying out the charitable and educational purposes and activities of the Nicholas and Dolly Goulandris Foundation - Museum of Cycladic Art, located in Athens; and;

WHEREAS, Stern has accumulated an extraordinary collection of Cycladic antiquities, consisting of 161 pieces, listed in Exhibit A hereto, representing one of the world's great sculptural traditions (the "Collection"); and

WHEREAS, Stern has agreed to contribute to HACI his rights and interests in the entire Collection, including his right of possession, subject to rescission of the contribution if certain conditions are not satisfied prior to the dates set out below; and

WHEREAS, HACI has evidenced its desire to receive the Collection and has agreed to utilize said Collection solely in concert with its charitable and educational purposes referenced above, but subject to rescission of the contribution and return of the Collection to Stern if the below-referenced conditions are not satisfied prior to the respective dates; and

WHEREAS, HACI will enter into an agreement with the Metropolitan Museum of Art in New York, New York (the "MET") for display of the Collection at the MET, identical to the agreement attached hereto as Exhibit B (the "Exhibition Agreement") after the full execution of this Contribution Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, to carry out their desires and intentions as indicated above, Stern and HACI hereby agree, Paragraph 1 being subject to the post-contribution conditions listed in Paragraph 2. below, as follows:

- 1. Stern hereby contributes his rights and interests in the Collection, including his right of possession, to HACI, and HACI hereby accepts the contribution and possession of the Collection from Stern, with the transfer of all of Stern's right and interest in and to the Collection to HACI being effectuated by this Contribution Agreement without the need of a separate assignment document.
- 2. It is hereby agreed that Stern's contribution of the Collection to HACI shall be rescinded and his rights and interests in the Collection including his right of possession in the Collection in its entirety shall be delivered to Stern at his expense, if the following events do not occur prior to the dates set out below:
- A. No later than July 21, 2022, HACI and the MET will have entered into the Exhibition Agreement establishing HACI's obligation to have the Collection displayed at the MET for not less than 25 years and not more than 50 years, and the MET's agreement to exhibit the Collection throughout the term of the display at the MET.

- B. No later than September 10, 2022, Stern, HACI and the MET shall have received formal approval from the Greek State in form and substance according to the Greek law (including, but not limited to, publication in the Government's Official Gazette) and reasonably acceptable to each of them of the contribution and display transactions evidenced by this Contribution Agreement and the Exhibition Agreement.
- 3. This Contribution Agreement is subject only to the afore-mentioned conditions, which cannot be expanded by either party by way of interpretation, and upon fulfillment of said conditions this Contribution Agreement becomes irrevocable.
- 4. Neither Stern nor HACI can change the terms of this Contribution Agreement without the written approval of the other signatory hereto.
- 5. This Contribution Agreement and any amendment hereto may be signed in any number of counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, but all of which taken together shall constitute one agreement (or amendment, as applicable).
- 6. The exchange of counterparts of this Contribution Agreement between the parties by means of facsimile transmission or by electronic email transmission (pdf) which shall contain authentic reproductions shall constitute a valid exchange of this Contribution Agreement and shall be binding upon the parties hereto.
- 7. This Contribution Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of New York. The parties hereto hereby irrevocably agree that any legal action or proceeding arising out of or relating to this Contribution Agreement may be brought in the Courts of the State of New York, or the Federal District Court for the Southern (00833923-1)

District of New York, as either such party may elect. By execution and delivery of this Contribution Agreement, each of the parties hereto hereby irrevocably accepts and submits generally and unconditionally for itself and with respect to its properties, to the jurisdiction of any such court in any such action or proceeding, and hereby waives in the case of any such action or proceeding brought in the courts of the State of New York, or Federal District Court for the Southern District of New York, any defenses based on jurisdiction, venue or forum non conveniens.





EXHIBITION AGREEMENT

entered into on this 21st day of July, 2022

Between

The Hellenic Ancient Culture Institute, Inc. (hereinafter "HACI"), c/o Roberts & Holland LLP, 1675 Broadway, New York, New York 10019, United States, represented by its Secretary, Peter John Goulandris,

and

The Metropolitan Museum of Art, 1000 Fifth Avenue, New York, New York, 10028, United States (hereafter the "MET") represented by Max Hollein, Maria Kellen French Director.

HACI and the MET are hereafter referred to singularly as a "Party" and collectively as the "Parties".

Whereas

- A. Leonard N. Stern ("Mr. Stern") has accumulated an extraordinary collection of Cycladic antiquities consisting of 161 pieces representing one of the world's great sculptural traditions (the collection of 161 pieces hereinafter referred to as the "Collection;" a listing of the pieces in the Collection is annexed hereto as Exhibit A); the Collection exists as a result of Mr. Stern's long-standing interest in not only Cycladic art but other art and artifacts of the Hellenic Republic and in the history of Greek Culture;
- B. Mr. Stern wishes to share the Collection with fellow New Yorkers and with the world through display of the Collection at the MET, which already has a significant collection of Greek art and artifacts on display;
- C. To that end, Mr. Stern entered into that certain Contribution Agreement with HACI on even date hereof, a copy of which is attached hereto, whereby Mr. Stern contributed all 161 antiquities from the Collection to HACI, subject to rescission of the contribution if either of two contemplated events described below does not happen before September 10, 2022;
- D. HACI hereby agrees to have the Collection exhibited at the MET, and to take any and all actions to ensure and guarantee the implementation of an exchange arrangement as described hereinbelow in accordance with this Agreement, its Articles of Incorporation and the Greek Patrimony Law;
- E. The MET agrees to prominently display the Collection in a dedicated gallery space to be built specifically for the entire Collection and to publish a catalog of the Collection; and
- F. Recognizing the importance of displaying Cycladic artwork in New York for the duration of

approval of the Greek State in accordance with this Agreement, HACI's Articles of Incorporation and the Greek Patrimony Law;

The Parties hereby agree as follows:

1. Recitals

The preceding recitals form an integral part of this Agreement.

2. Contribution of Collection to HACI

Mr. Stern has contributed the Collection to HACI, subject to the post-contribution conditions set forth in the Contribution Agreement between Mr. Stern and HACI, i.e., that this Agreement has been executed by the Parties no later than July 21, 2022, and that that certain 4-party Agreement by and among the Ministry of Culture and Sport of the Hellenic Republic (the "Ministry"), HACI, the MET, and the Museum of Cycladic Art of Athens (the "Museum") dated July 21, 2022 has been formally approved by the Greek State (including publication in the Government's Official Gazette) no later than September 10, 2022.

3. HACI's Obligation to Display the Collection at the MET

Upon Mr. Stern's contribution of the Collection to HACI, HACI will have the Collection exhibited at the MET ("the Exhibition") as set forth in this Agreement.

4. MET's display of the Collection

The MET will install a new gallery space (the "Gallery Space") dedicated to the display of the Collection, to be completed in an expeditious manner upon execution of this Agreement.

6. Recognition of Mr. Stern

The MET will celebrate Mr. Stern's generosity, and the collaboration among the Parties and Mr. Stern, by hosting an opening reception at the MET on or prior to the opening of the exhibition (the "Exhibition Opening").

7. Timetable for Exhibition

- A. <u>Initial Phase</u>. Upon and subject to formal approval of the Contribution and Exhibition Agreements by the Greek Parliament prior to September 10, 2022, the following events will occur:
 - (i) Initially, HACI will keep and maintain the entire Collection at Mr. Stern's present residence during which time Mr. Stern will be responsible for the Collection's security and insurance;
 - (ii) By September 30, 2022, with the exception of the large idol (#105), the Collection will be delivered to the MET at the direction of HACI and at the care, responsibility and expense of the MET. The largest idol will be delivered to the MET on or before December 31, 2022. From the dates the Collection and the large idol are delivered to the MET, the MET will be responsible for their insurance and security.
- B. No later than October 15, 2022, the MET will deliver 15 Collection works, listed on Exhibit B hereto, to the Museum. Said 15 Collection Works will be exhibited for a period not to exceed one (1) year, from November 1, 2022 through October 31, 2023, in an appropriately designed space in the Museum suitable for their display and protection. At the end of said one-year period, or on or prior to November 10, 2023, the 15 Collection works must and shall be delivered by the Museum and HACI for installation at the MET. The remaining 146 works in the Collection shall remain at the MET for conservation and study prior to the installation of the Collection for the Exhibition Opening, currently planned for a date between January 1, 2024 and January 29, 2024. In the event the MET fails to comply with the first sentence of this Section 7.B., HACI will be entitled to pursue legal action in an appropriate court in the State of New York for the enforcement of the obligation to send the 15 Collection works to the Museum. Any failure of the Museum or HACI, as the case may be, to deliver the 15 Collection works to the MET in a timely manner as required pursuant to this Section 7.B. will entitle Mr. Stern (or his designee), as a third-party beneficiary of this Exhibition Agreement, to pursue legal action in the appropriate court in the State of New York to compel specific performance of the obligation to deliver the 15 Collection works to the MET.
- C. <u>Following Ten Years</u>. The MET agrees to display in the Gallery Space all of the Collection works for a ten-year period commencing between January 1, 2024 and January 29, 2024 and ending on December 31, 2033.

D. Series of Exchanges for following 15 years.

1. Years 11-15. From January 1, 2034 until December 31, 2038, the MET shall retain no fewer than 146 Collection works, and transfer the remaining 15 Collection works to be displayed at the Museum and/or any such other museums in Greece, as HACI's Board of Directors will each time indicate in accordance with the laws of the Hellenic Republic on cultural heritage and HACI's Articles of Incorporation. HACI and the MET are entitled to decide on issues regarding the selection of the Collection works, ensuring a balanced representation of the Collection; in exchange,

the 15 works removed from the MET will be replaced under the responsibility of HACI, with an equal number of pieces of Cycladic art from Greece of equal significance and beauty as the works of the Collection, to be delivered to the MET under the responsibility of HACI in accordance with the Greek Patrimony Law, and approved by the MET, through a loan to the MET for fifteen (15) years ending December 31, 2048.

- Years 16-20. From January 1, 2039 until December 31, 2043, the MET shall retain no fewer than 131 Collection works, and transfer the remaining 15 Collection works to be displayed at the Museum and/or any such other museums in Greece, as HACI's Board of Directors will each time indicate in accordance with the laws of the Hellenic Republic on cultural heritage and HACI's Articles of Incorporation. HACI and the MET are entitled to decide on issues regarding the selection of the Collection works, ensuring a balanced representation of the Collection; in exchange, the 15 works removed from the MET will be replaced under the responsibility of HACI, with an equal number of pieces of Cycladic art from Greece of equal significance and beauty as the works of the Collection, to be delivered to the MET under the responsibility of HACI in accordance with the Greek Patrimony Law, and approved by the MET, through a loan to the MET for ten (10) years ending December 31, 2048.
- 3. Years 21-25. From January 1, 2044 until December 31, 2048, the MET shall retain no fewer than 116 Collection works, and transfer the remaining 15 Collection works to be displayed at the Museum and/or any such other museums in Greece, as HACI's Board of Directors will each time indicate in accordance with the laws of the Hellenic Republic on cultural heritage and HACI's Articles of Incorporation. HACI and the MET are entitled to decide on issues regarding the selection of the Collection works, ensuring a balanced representation of the Collection; in exchange, the 15 works removed from the MET will be replaced under the responsibility of HACI, with an equal number of pieces of Cycladic art from Greece of equal significance and beauty as the works of the Collection, to be delivered to the MET under the responsibility of HACI in accordance with the Greek Patrimony Law, and approved by the MET, through a loan to the MET for five (5) years ending December 31, 2048.

E. Next 25 Years

- 1. For the purpose of maintaining a major installation of Cycladic art at the MET for a period of 50 years, HACI, undertakes to take any and all actions and guarantee the display of 122 or more works of Cycladic art at the MET from January 1, 2049 and continuing for a period of 25 years in accordance with the Greek Patrimony Law, as follows:
 - (i) by entering into a loan to the MET regarding the Collection in whole or in part, or
 - (ii) by requesting the remaining Collection works be shipped to Greece and in exchange making loans to the MET of 122 pieces of Cycladic art of equal significance and beauty to

the Collection. The Cycladic art pieces to be lent through replacement loans will be selected by HACI in accordance with the Greek Patrimony Law in consultation with the MET and approved by the Museum and the MET.

8. Enforcement of Mr. Stern's Interests

Mr. Stern and/or any specifically authorized officer of The Leonard Stern Family Foundation is empowered to review the actions of the Parties as set forth in this Agreement and to enforce this Agreement and every provision of it, including any aspect of the 4-party Agreement entered into by the Ministry that is approved by the Greek State and that entitles Mr. Stern to take certain actions under the circumstances specified therein, it being acknowledged and agreed that Mr. Stern and The Leonard Stern Family Foundation are third party beneficiaries of this Agreement, having relied upon the provisions of this Agreement in Mr. Stern contributing the Collection to HACI.

9. Costs of shipping and insurance

- A. The MET shall make the shipping arrangements and bear the shipping costs of the Initial Phase Exhibition (paragraphs 7.A and B), the Initial Ten-Year Period and the three exchange transactions described above over the following 15 years; except at the termination of the Collection exhibition, HACI shall bear the cost of shipping the 116 or more remaining Collection works to Greece.
- B. The MET will insure the Collection while on site there and while works are in transit to and from the MET and museums designated by HACI. HACI shall be responsible for insuring the Collection works at museums designated by HACI.
- C. For the period January 1, 2049 through December 31, 2073, the parties shall agree to the distribution of associated costs and insurance responsibilities as an element of the loan agreements relative to that time period.

10. Conditions of Exhibition

HACI and the MET agree that the Exhibition will adhere to the MET's standard conditions of loan, attached hereto as Exhibit C. Further, HACI and the MET recognize that loan standards and conditions may evolve over time, and therefore agree to review the Museum's standard conditions of loan every ten years so that the understanding between the Parties remains current.

11. Credit Lines

Collection works will be displayed at the MET with the following credit lines:

Leonard N. Stern Collection (on the wall above the Collection Gallery)

Hellenic Republic-Ministry of Culture and Sports Museum of Cycladic Art-Athens Loan of Cycladic Art to the MET (all on the wall adjacent to the Collection)

12. Complete Agreement

Except as otherwise set forth herein, this Agreement contains all agreements entered into between the Parties hereunder, and will be effective on July 21, 2022.

13. Counterparts

This Exhibition Agreement and any amendment hereto may be signed in any number of counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, but all of which taken together shall constitute one agreement (or amendment, as applicable).

14. Electronic Signatures/Counterparts

The exchange of counterparts of this Exhibition Agreement between the parties by means of facsimile transmission or by electronic email transmission (pdf) which shall contain authentic reproductions shall constitute a valid exchange of this Exhibition Agreement and shall be binding upon the parties hereto.

15. Law and Jurisdiction

Without prejudice to clause 8 of the 4-party Agreement, this Exhibition Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of New York. The parties hereto hereby irrevocably agree that any legal action or proceeding arising out of or relating to this Exhibition Agreement may be brought in the Courts of the State of New York, or the Federal District Court for the Southern District of New York, as either such party may elect. By execution and delivery of this Exhibition Agreement, each of the parties hereto hereby irrevocably accepts and submits generally and unconditionally for itself and with respect to its properties, to the jurisdiction of any such court in any such action or proceeding, and hereby waives in the case of any such action or proceeding brought in the courts of the State of New York, or Federal District Court for the Southern District of New York, any defenses based on jurisdiction, venue or forum non conveniens.

Stern ("Mr. Stern") has accumulated an extraordinary collection of Cycladic antiquities consisting of 161 pieces representing one of the world's great sculptural traditions (the collection of 161 pieces hereinafter referred to as the "Collection;" a listing of the pieces in the Collection is annexed hereto as Exhibit A); the Collection exists as a result of Mr. Stern's long-standing interest in not only Cycladic art but other art and artifacts of the Hellenic Republic and in the history of Greek Culture;
- B. Mr. Stern wishes to share the Collection with fellow New Yorkers and with the world through display of the Collection at the MET, which already has a significant collection of Greek art and artifacts on display;
- C. To that end, Mr. Stern entered into that certain Contribution Agreement with HACI on even date hereof, a copy of which is attached hereto, whereby Mr. Stern contributed all 161 antiquities from the Collection to HACI, subject to rescission of the contribution if either of two contemplated events described below does not happen before September 10, 2022;
- D. HACI hereby agrees to have the Collection exhibited at the MET, and to take any and all actions to ensure and guarantee the implementation of an exchange arrangement as described hereinbelow in accordance with this Agreement, its Articles of Incorporation and the Greek Patrimony Law;
- E. The MET agrees to prominently display the Collection in a dedicated gallery space to be built specifically for the entire Collection and to publish a catalog of the Collection; and
- F. Recognizing the importance of displaying Cycladic artwork in New York for the duration of

approval of the Greek State in accordance with this Agreement, HACI's Articles of Incorporation and the Greek Patrimony Law;

The Parties hereby agree as follows:

1. Recitals

The preceding recitals form an integral part of this Agreement.

2. Contribution of Collection to HACI

Mr. Stern has contributed the Collection to HACI, subject to the post-contribution conditions set forth in the Contribution Agreement between Mr. Stern and HACI, i.e., that this Agreement has been executed by the Parties no later than July 21, 2022, and that that certain 4-party Agreement by and among the Ministry of Culture and Sport of the Hellenic Republic (the "Ministry"), HACI, the MET, and the Museum of Cycladic Art of Athens (the "Museum") dated July 21, 2022 has been formally approved by the Greek State (including publication in the Government's Official Gazette) no later than September 10, 2022.

3. HACI's Obligation to Display the Collection at the MET

Upon Mr. Stern's contribution of the Collection to HACI, HACI will have the Collection exhibited at the MET ("the Exhibition") as set forth in this Agreement.

4. MET's display of the Collection

The MET will install a new gallery space (the "Gallery Space") dedicated to the display of the Collection, to be completed in an expeditious manner upon execution of this Agreement.

6. Recognition of Mr. Stern

The MET will celebrate Mr. Stern's generosity, and the collaboration among the Parties and Mr. Stern, by hosting an opening reception at the MET on or prior to the opening of the exhibition (the "Exhibition Opening").

7. Timetable for Exhibition

- A. <u>Initial Phase</u>. Upon and subject to formal approval of the Contribution and Exhibition Agreements by the Greek Parliament prior to September 10, 2022, the following events will occur:
 - (i) Initially, HACI will keep and maintain the entire Collection at Mr. Stern's present residence during which time Mr. Stern will be responsible for the Collection's security and insurance;
 - (ii) By September 30, 2022, with the exception of the large idol (#105), the Collection will be delivered to the MET at the direction of HACI and at the care, responsibility and expense of the MET. The largest idol will be delivered to the MET on or before December 31, 2022. From the dates the Collection and the large idol are delivered to the MET, the MET will be responsible for their insurance and security.
- B. No later than October 15, 2022, the MET will deliver 15 Collection works, listed on Exhibit B hereto, to the Museum. Said 15 Collection Works will be exhibited for a period not to exceed one (1) year, from November 1, 2022 through October 31, 2023, in an appropriately designed space in the Museum suitable for their display and protection. At the end of said one-year period, or on or prior to November 10, 2023, the 15 Collection works must and shall be delivered by the Museum and HACI for installation at the MET. The remaining 146 works in the Collection shall remain at the MET for conservation and study prior to the installation of the Collection for the Exhibition Opening, currently planned for a date between January 1, 2024 and January 29, 2024. In the event the MET fails to comply with the first sentence of this Section 7.B., HACI will be entitled to pursue legal action in an appropriate court in the State of New York for the enforcement of the obligation to send the 15 Collection works to the Museum. Any failure of the Museum or HACI, as the case may be, to deliver the 15 Collection works to the MET in a timely manner as required pursuant to this Section 7.B. will entitle Mr. Stern (or his designee), as a third-party beneficiary of this Exhibition Agreement, to pursue legal action in the appropriate court in the State of New York to compel specific performance of the obligation to deliver the 15 Collection works to the MET.
- C. <u>Following Ten Years</u>. The MET agrees to display in the Gallery Space all of the Collection works for a ten-year period commencing between January 1, 2024 and January 29, 2024 and ending on December 31, 2033.

D. Series of Exchanges for following 15 years.

1. Years 11-15. From January 1, 2034 until December 31, 2038, the MET shall retain no fewer than 146 Collection works, and transfer the remaining 15 Collection works to be displayed at the Museum and/or any such other museums in Greece, as HACI's Board of Directors will each time indicate in accordance with the laws of the Hellenic Republic on cultural heritage and HACI's Articles of Incorporation. HACI and the MET are entitled to decide on issues regarding the selection of the Collection works, ensuring a balanced representation of the Collection; in exchange,

the 15 works removed from the MET will be replaced under the responsibility of HACI, with an equal number of pieces of Cycladic art from Greece of equal significance and beauty as the works of the Collection, to be delivered to the MET under the responsibility of HACI in accordance with the Greek Patrimony Law, and approved by the MET, through a loan to the MET for fifteen (15) years ending December 31, 2048.

- Years 16-20. From January 1, 2039 until December 31, 2043, the MET shall retain no fewer than 131 Collection works, and transfer the remaining 15 Collection works to be displayed at the Museum and/or any such other museums in Greece, as HACI's Board of Directors will each time indicate in accordance with the laws of the Hellenic Republic on cultural heritage and HACI's Articles of Incorporation. HACI and the MET are entitled to decide on issues regarding the selection of the Collection works, ensuring a balanced representation of the Collection; in exchange, the 15 works removed from the MET will be replaced under the responsibility of HACI, with an equal number of pieces of Cycladic art from Greece of equal significance and beauty as the works of the Collection, to be delivered to the MET under the responsibility of HACI in accordance with the Greek Patrimony Law, and approved by the MET, through a loan to the MET for ten (10) years ending December 31, 2048.
- 3. Years 21-25. From January 1, 2044 until December 31, 2048, the MET shall retain no fewer than 116 Collection works, and transfer the remaining 15 Collection works to be displayed at the Museum and/or any such other museums in Greece, as HACI's Board of Directors will each time indicate in accordance with the laws of the Hellenic Republic on cultural heritage and HACI's Articles of Incorporation. HACI and the MET are entitled to decide on issues regarding the selection of the Collection works, ensuring a balanced representation of the Collection; in exchange, the 15 works removed from the MET will be replaced under the responsibility of HACI, with an equal number of pieces of Cycladic art from Greece of equal significance and beauty as the works of the Collection, to be delivered to the MET under the responsibility of HACI in accordance with the Greek Patrimony Law, and approved by the MET, through a loan to the MET for five (5) years ending December 31, 2048.

E. Next 25 Years

- 1. For the purpose of maintaining a major installation of Cycladic art at the MET for a period of 50 years, HACI, undertakes to take any and all actions and guarantee the display of 122 or more works of Cycladic art at the MET from January 1, 2049 and continuing for a period of 25 years in accordance with the Greek Patrimony Law, as follows:
 - (i) by entering into a loan to the MET regarding the Collection in whole or in part, or
 - (ii) by requesting the remaining Collection works be shipped to Greece and in exchange making loans to the MET of 122 pieces of Cycladic art of equal significance and beauty to

the Collection. The Cycladic art pieces to be lent through replacement loans will be selected by HACI in accordance with the Greek Patrimony Law in consultation with the MET and approved by the Museum and the MET.

8. Enforcement of Mr. Stern's Interests

Mr. Stern and/or any specifically authorized officer of The Leonard Stern Family Foundation is empowered to review the actions of the Parties as set forth in this Agreement and to enforce this Agreement and every provision of it, including any aspect of the 4-party Agreement entered into by the Ministry that is approved by the Greek State and that entitles Mr. Stern to take certain actions under the circumstances specified therein, it being acknowledged and agreed that Mr. Stern and The Leonard Stern Family Foundation are third party beneficiaries of this Agreement, having relied upon the provisions of this Agreement in Mr. Stern contributing the Collection to HACI.

9. Costs of shipping and insurance

- A. The MET shall make the shipping arrangements and bear the shipping costs of the Initial Phase Exhibition (paragraphs 7.A and B), the Initial Ten-Year Period and the three exchange transactions described above over the following 15 years; except at the termination of the Collection exhibition, HACI shall bear the cost of shipping the 116 or more remaining Collection works to Greece.
- B. The MET will insure the Collection while on site there and while works are in transit to and from the MET and museums designated by HACI. HACI shall be responsible for insuring the Collection works at museums designated by HACI.
- C. For the period January 1, 2049 through December 31, 2073, the parties shall agree to the distribution of associated costs and insurance responsibilities as an element of the loan agreements relative to that time period.

10. Conditions of Exhibition

HACI and the MET agree that the Exhibition will adhere to the MET's standard conditions of loan, attached hereto as Exhibit C. Further, HACI and the MET recognize that loan standards and conditions may evolve over time, and therefore agree to review the Museum's standard conditions of loan every ten years so that the understanding between the Parties remains current.

12. Complete Agreement

Except as otherwise set forth herein, this Agreement contains all agreements entered into between the Parties hereunder, and will be effective on July 21, 2022.

13. Counterparts

This Exhibition Agreement and any amendment hereto may be signed in any number of counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, but all of which taken together shall constitute one agreement (or amendment, as applicable).

14. Electronic Signatures/Counterparts

The exchange of counterparts of this Exhibition Agreement between the parties by means of facsimile transmission or by electronic email transmission (pdf) which shall contain authentic reproductions shall constitute a valid exchange of this Exhibition Agreement and shall be binding upon the parties hereto.

15. Law and Jurisdiction

Without prejudice to clause 8 of the 4-party Agreement, this Exhibition Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of New York. The parties hereto hereby irrevocably agree that any legal action or proceeding arising out of or relating to this Exhibition Agreement may be brought in the Courts of the State of New York, or the Federal District Court for the Southern District of New York, as either such party may elect. By execution and delivery of this Exhibition Agreement, each of the parties hereto hereby irrevocably accepts and submits generally and unconditionally for itself and with respect to its properties, to the jurisdiction of any such court in any such action or proceeding, and hereby waives in the case of any such action or proceeding brought in the courts of the State of New York, or Federal District Court for the Southern District of New York, any defenses based on jurisdiction, venue or forum non conveniens.

Annex E: Joint Projects to be Undertaken

ANNEX E'

Within the context of this historic cooperation between Hellenic Republic and the MET, the Ministry, the MET and the Cycladic Museum are committed to collaborate on the advancement of the study of and education about Cycladic Art as follows:

- 1. The Met will publish at the expense of the MET a complete, museum-quality Catalogue of the Collection. The authors of the catalogue will include two Cycladic art specialists selected by the Ministry, in consultation with The Met. The catalogue will include introductions from the Minister of Culture, the Director of the Met and the President of the Cycladic Museum signing this agreement, and L.S.. The MET will also publish the works of the Collection digitally.
- 2. The Ministry and the Cycladic Museum will publish, each at its own expense, complete, museum-quality Catalogues of the Collection in the Greek language, one year after the publication of the MET Catalogue. The Catalogue of the Museum shall be approved by the Ministry. The catalogues will include introductions from the Minister of Culture, the Director of the Met and the President of the Cycladic Museum signing this agreement, and L.S..
- 3. The Ministry, the Met and the Museum will enter into a Memorandum of Understanding, to be signed by December 31, 2022, which may include, subject to further discussion and funding, the following projects:
- (i) establishment of a scholarship by the MET for Greek archaeologists for the study of Cycladic art work. The scholarship will be announced every three years.
- (ii) Producing a high-quality educational narrative film for the public, schools and universities. The narrative will be based on real archaeological evidence and will include virtual representation of settlements and other archaeological material of the Cycladic civilization, and will be subtitled in both languages, Greek and English. The film can be used on the websites and shown on screen in the collection gallery.
- (iii) collaboration in the area of conservation and education in the field of conferences, fellowships for study, archaeological fieldwork, further publications and public programming.



	3	Στο άρθρο 3 προβλέπεται η κύρωση της σύμβασης μεταξύ του Υπουργείου Πολιτισμού και Αθλητισμού, του Κυκλαδικού Μουσείου, του ΜΕΤ και του Hellenic Ancient Culture Institute Inc. (Ινστιτούτου Αρχαίου Ελληνικού Πολιτισμού) του Ντελαγουέρ («ΗΑCΙ»). Συγκεκριμένα, στο Μέρος Α΄ της προς κύρωση σύμβασης τα μέρη δηλώνουν και αποδέχονται τα εξής: 1. Ο ΗΑCΙ αποτελεί μη κερδοσκοπικό νομικό πρόσωπο που εδρεύει στο Ντελαγουέρ των ΗΠΑ και έχει στους σκοπούς του την προβολή της ελληνικής πολιτιστικής κληρονομιάς και την τόνωση του παγκόσμιου ενδιαφέροντος και της γνώσης σχετικά με τις ελληνικές αρχαιότητες. Με αποφάσεις του Διοικητικού		

του Συμβουλίου, του οποίου ο Πρόεδρος και η πλειοψηφία των μελών επιλέγονται από το Κυκλαδικό Μουσείο, ο HACI δύναται, μεταξύ άλλων, να αποκτά έργα τέχνης, αντικείμενα και μνημεία της Ελλάδας που χρονολογούνται από τους προϊστορικούς χρόνους έως και τον Μεσαίωνα, να μεριμνά για τη φύλαξη, μελέτη και έκθεσή τους σε μουσεία ή άλλους κατάλληλους χώρους, με το δικαίωμα της τελικής μεταβίβασης στο Κυκλαδικό Μουσείο ή σε άλλα μουσεία της Ελλάδας. Σύμφωνα με ρητή πρόβλεψή στο καταστατικό του, ο HACI προβαίνει στις προαναφερθείσες δράσεις σχετικά με τις ελληνικές αρχαιότητες με την προϋπόθεση της τήρησης των όσων ορίζει η νομοθεσία περί πολιτιστικής κληρονομιάς του Ελληνικού Κράτους.

2. Την 21η Ιουλίου 2022, δυνάμει σχετικής συμφωνίας («Contribution Agreement»), η οποία υπεγράφη στη Νέα Υόρκη, ενώπιον συμβολαιογράφου, ο HACI, απέκτησε μια συλλογή 161 κυκλαδικών αρχαιοτήτων από φυσικό πρόσωπο (τον συλλέκτη Leonard Stern, μόνιμο κάτοικο Νέας Υόρκης). Η σύμβαση αυτή καταρτίστηκε σύμφωνα με το δίκαιο της Νέας Υόρκης, το οποίο διέπει αμφότερα τα συμβαλλόμενα μέρη αλλά και τον τόπο κατάρτισής της και προβλέπει ότι ο HACI θα μεριμνήσει για την έκθεση των αρχαιοτήτων της συλλογής στο ΜΕΤ και την τελική επιστροφή τους στην Ελλάδα. Ακολούθως, με το Μέρος Β΄ της προς κύρωση σύμβασης, τα μέρη δηλώνουν και αποδέχονται ότι το Ελληνικό Κράτος:

- -συμβάλλεται κυριαρχικά στη Σύμβαση ως ο μοναδικός ιδιοκτήτης των αρχαιοτήτων, όπως προβλέπει ο ελληνικός αρχαιολογικός νόμος,
- -υπό την ιδιότητά του, ως ανέκαθεν κυρίου των αρχαιοτήτων, αναγνωρίζει τον HACI μόνο ως κάτοχο αυτών, κατοχή που προέκυψε ως πραγματική κατάσταση, λόγω της προαναφερθείσας Σύμβαση Εισφοράς. Επισημαίνεται ότι ο ελληνικός αρχαιολογικός νόμος προβλέπει και επιτρέπει την κατοχή αρχαιοτήτων από ιδιώτες, με έγκριση του ΥΠΠΟΑ.
- -αναγνωρίζει τον HACI ως κάτοχο μόνο για τους συγκεκριμένους σκοπούς της προς κύρωση σύμβασης, που είναι η έκθεση των αρχαιοτήτων στο MET και η επιστροφή τους στην Ελλάδα, με μέριμνα και επιμέλεια του HACI
- -εγκρίνει την κατοχή των αρχαιοτήτων από τον HACI, την έκθεσή τους στο MET και την επιστροφή τους στην Ελλάδα με

τους πιο κάτω όρους, οι οποίοι στο σύνολό τους βαίνουν αδιαμφισβήτητα υπέρ των συμφερόντων του Ελληνικού Δημοσίου. Ειδικότερα,

α. Ο HACI υποχρεούται να παραδώσει τις αρχαιότητες στο MET το αργότερο έως την 30η.9.2022 προκειμένου να εκτεθούν αυτές σε αίθουσα του MET, την οποία το MET υποχρεούται να διαμορφώσει ειδικά και κατάλληλα για αυτές τις αρχαιότητες και με σταθερή και εμφανή επιτοίχια ένδειξη που θα δηλώνει την ιδιοκτησία του Ελληνικού Κράτους. Συγκεκριμένα, στον τοίχο της αίθουσας θα χαραχθεί στην αγγλική γλώσσα η εξής αναφορά:

«ΕΛΛΗΝΙΚΗ ΔΗΜΟΚΡΑΤΙΑ – ΥΠΟΥΡΓΕΙΟ ΠΟΛΙΤΙΣΜΟΥ ΚΑΙ ΑΘΛΗΤΙΣΜΟΥ ΜΟΥΣΕΙΟ ΚΥΚΛΑΔΙΚΗΣ ΤΕΧΝΗΣ, ΑΘΗΝΑ ΔΑΝΕΙΟ ΚΥΚΛΑΔΙΚΗΣ ΤΕΧΝΗΣ ΠΡΟΣ ΤΟ ΜΕΤ»

Το Ελληνικό Κράτος δεν θα επιβαρυνθεί οικονομικά, διότι η δαπάνη της μεταφοράς των αρχαιοτήτων στους χώρους του ΜΕΤ, συμφωνήθηκε ότι βαρύνει το ΜΕΤ.

β. Η πρώτη παγκόσμια εμφάνιση της συλλογής σε κοινό θα διενεργηθεί στην Ελλάδα. Συγκεκριμένα, ο ΗΑΟΙ θα αποστείλει στην Ελλάδα δεκαπέντε (15) αρχαιότητες, το αργότερο έως την 15η.10.2022, οι οποίες θα εκτεθούν άμεσα και για διάστημα ενός έτους (1η.11.2022 έως και 31η.10.2023) σε χώρο που υποχρεούται να διαμορφώσει ειδικά και κατάλληλα γι' αυτές το Κυκλαδικό Μουσείο. Σημειώνεται ότι οι εν λόγω αρχαιότητες προσδιορίζονται στο ειδικό Παράρτημα Δ' της προς κύρωση συμφωνίας και αποτελούν εξαιρετικά σημαντικά δείγματα που δεν εκπροσωπούνται ήδη στα μουσεία της Χώρας. Μετά την παρέλευση του έτους, οι αρχαιότητες θα αποσταλούν στο ΜΕΤ προκειμένου να ακολουθήσει η έκθεση και προβολή τους προς το διεθνές κοινό του ΜΕΤ. Ούτε για την αποστολή αυτή προβλέπεται οικονομική επιβάρυνση του Ελληνικού Δημοσίου, διότι η δαπάνη της μεταφοράς των εν λόγω αρχαιοτήτων προς και από την Ελλάδα επίσης συμφωνήθηκε να βαρύνει το ΜΕΤ, στο σύνολό της.

γ. Η ως άνω αίθουσα με την προαναφερθείσα σήμανση της ιδιοκτησίας της Ελλάδας δεσμεύεται για την ανάδειξη του κυκλαδικού πολιτισμού, χωρίς οικονομική επιβάρυνση του Ελληνικού Δημοσίου μέσω της προβολής της συλλογής αλλά και άλλων μνημείων κυκλαδικού πολιτισμού από τα ελληνικά μουσεία ως εξής:

-Έκθεση των εκατόν εξήντα μίας (161) αρχαιοτήτων για δέκα (10) έτη (Ιανουάριος 2024 - Δεκέμβριος 2033).

- -Μετά το τέλος της ως άνω δεκαετούς περιόδου, οριστική επιστροφή στην Ελλάδα, ανά πενταετία (συγκεκριμένα την 1η.1.2034, την 1η.1.2039 και την 1η.1.2044) και με δαπάνες του ΜΕΤ, δεκαπέντε (15) αρχαιοτήτων της συλλογής που θα επιλέγει το Υπουργείο και έκθεσή τους σε μουσεία της Ελλάδας, όπως θα εγκρίνει κάθε φορά το Υπουργείο.
- -Λήξη της έκθεσης της συλλογής στο ΜΕΤ την 31η.12.2048, επιστροφή στην Ελλάδα των αρχαιοτήτων της συλλογής που βρίσκονται τότε στο ΜΕΤ, με ίση δαπάνη του Ελληνικού Κράτους και του Κυκλαδικού Μουσείου και έκθεσή τους σε μουσεία της Ελλάδας, όπως θα εγκρίνει τότε το Υπουργείο Πολιτισμού και Αθλητισμού.
- -Δυνατότητα του Ελληνικού Κράτους, κατά την απόλυτη ευχέρειά του, να συμφωνήσει με το MET τον δανεισμό της συλλογής για τη χρονική περίοδο από την 1η.1.2049 και εφεξής και με διάρκεια έως είκοσι πέντε (25) έτη.
- δ. Προς τον σκοπό της διαρκούς και πολυετούς προβολής της κυκλαδικής τέχνης στο ΜΕΤ συμφωνείται η αποστολή από το Ελληνικό Κράτος, με δαπάνες του ΜΕΤ, και η έκθεση στην ως άνω αίθουσα με την προαναφερθείσα ένδειξη, αρχαιοτήτων του Κυκλαδικού Πολιτισμού από τα μουσεία της Ελλάδας, τις οποίες θα επιλέγει το Υπουργείο Πολιτισμού και Αθλητισμού και θα αποστέλλει λόγω δανεισμού, ως εξής: δεκαπέντε (15) αρχαιότητες για το διάστημα από 1.1.2034-31.12.2048, δεκαπέντε (15) αρχαιότητες για το διάστημα από 1.1.2039-31.12.2048 και δεκαπέντε (15) αρχαιότητες για το διάστημα από 1.1.2044-31.12.2048. Σε περίπτωση μη δανεισμού της συλλογής εκ μέρους του Ελληνικού Κράτους προς το ΜΕΤ, για το διάστημα από την 1η.1.2049 και εφεξής, αποστολή με δαπάνες του ΜΕΤ και έκθεση στην ως άνω αίθουσα με την προαναφερθείσα ένδειξη και για περίοδο είκοσι πέντε (25) ετών από την 1η.1.2049, εκατόν είκοσι δύο (122) αρχαιοτήτων του Κυκλαδικού Πολιτισμού από τα μουσεία της Ελλάδας που θα αποστείλει τότε το Ελληνικό Κράτος στο ΜΕΤ, λόγω δανεισμού, σύμφωνα με όρους, που θα συμφωνηθούν τότε μεταξύ του Ελληνικού Δημοσίου, του Κυκλαδικού Μουσείου και του ΜΕΤ.
- **ε.** Καθορισμός των Δικαστηρίων της Αθήνας ως αρμόδιων δικαστηρίων για την επίλυση τυχόν διαφορών από την προς κύρωση συμφωνία.
- **στ.** Καθορισμός της ελληνικής νομοθεσίας ως εφαρμοστέου δικαίου για την επίλυση τυχόν διαφορών από την προς κύρωση συμφωνία.

- (α) Έκδοση, με δαπάνη του ΜΕΤ, πλήρους μουσειακού καταλόγου της συλλογής, ο οποίος θα συνταχθεί με τη συμμετοχή δύο ειδικών επιστημόνων της επιλογής του Υπουργείου και θα περιέχει προλόγους εκ μέρους του Διευθυντή του ΜΕΤ, της Υπουργού Πολιτισμού και Αθλητισμού και της Προέδρου του Κυκλαδικού Μουσείου.
- (β) Έκδοση Καταλόγου της συλλογής στην ελληνική γλώσσα από το ΥΠΠΟΑ και το Κυκλαδικό Μουσείο, ένα έτος μετά την έκδοση του Καταλόγου του ΜΕΤ. Το Κυκλαδικό Μουσείο θα βαρύνεται με τη δαπάνη έκδοσης του δικού του Καταλόγου, ο οποίος θα πρέπει να υποβληθεί προς έγκριση στο ΥΠΠΟΑ.
- **(γ)** Προκήρυξη, ανά τρία έτη, υποτροφίας από το ΜΕΤ για Έλληνες αρχαιολόγους σχετικά με τη μελέτη του Κυκλαδικού Πολιτισμού,
- (δ) Παραγωγή στην ελληνική και στην αγγλική γλώσσα, υψηλής ποιότητας οπτικοακουστικού εκπαιδευτικού υλικού για τον κυκλαδικό πολιτισμό, το οποίο θα προβάλλεται εντός της αίθουσας της συλλογής στο ΜΕΤ, θα χρησιμοποιηθεί στις ιστοσελίδες του ΥΠΠΟΑ και του ΜΕΤ και θα απευθύνεται και σε σχολεία και πανεπιστήμια της Ελλάδας και της αλλοδαπής,
- (ε) Συνεργασία μεταξύ ΥΠΠΟΑ και ΜΕΤ στον τομέα της συντήρησης και της εκπαίδευσης, στη διοργάνωση συνεδρίων, τη χορήγηση εκπαιδευτικών και ερευνητικών υποτροφιών, καθώς και την ανάπτυξη συνεργειών σε αρχαιολογικές εργασίες πεδίου.
- (στ) Κατάρτιση έως την 31η.12.2022 Μνημονίου Συνεργασίας μεταξύ του ΥΠΠΟΑ, του ΜΕΤ και του Κυκλαδικού Μουσείου σχετικά με τις ειδικότερες λεπτομέρειες των υπό στοιχεία (γ), (δ) και (ε) δράσεων.

- Β. Έκθεση του άρθρου 75 παρ. 1 και 2 του ΣυντάγματοςΒΛ. ΣΥΝΗΜΜΕΝΑ

Α.
